





She had no experience sewing and the repairman showed her how to use the machine. The tools she uses in her quilts are glue stick, crayons, sharpies and fusible web. She showed her 1st quilt, a bookshelf quilt, then some fantasy collage quilts and then her portrait quilts. She showed portrait quilts made with only 2 colors. Bring your quilts and fill out the entry form on Thursday, October 13, from 3 to 6




Bring A Friend
