Prelude to Christmas Memorable, **Festive and Warm**

Temperatures topped 45 degrees Saturday at noon as visitors and residents alike enjoyed the annual Amana Prelude to Christmas celebration in the Colonies.

Following the large, Thanksgiving weekend crowds at the Tannenbaum Forest, it was nice to see so many people in town for Prelude. Judging by the crowded parking lots and the number of visitors walking about Saturday and Sunday, this was a well-attended festival.

David Rettig, Amana Colonies Convention and Visitors Bureau executive director, reports that they've seen a 30% increase in the number of visitors at the Forest this year compared to the first two weekends last year. On Saturday, Nov. 30 for example, over 500 people toured the forest during one, two-hour period.

"It was certainly one for the record books I would think," said one Main Street merchant. "The weather was perfect and I think every one had a great time

Friday at 7 p.m. about 120 people attended the Advent at the Tannenbaum Forest service led by Amana Church Elder Jon Childers. Twelve children (from across lowa) portrayed angels or shepherds as Elder Childers read Scripture and ancient carols in German and in English were sung with the support of members of the Amana Church choir.

Another event the Amana Arts Guild Haus Walk was well attended with the anticipated number of patrons visiting four private homes and the Amana Arts Guild folk arts and crafts fair at the AAG Center. "We were really pleased and the weather helped . . . I think visitors enjoyed that we had two homes right on main street too and we got a lot of nice compliments." said Deb Hawkes, AAG director, The Amana Arts Guild director was interviewed by Channel 2 news Sunday evening.

At the Amana Church the bazaar and cookie walk were popular stops. "We were really pleased with the turnout and the amount of things we sold, es-

I am sorry to say my children's idea of Christmas cookies are chocolate. Our grandaughter prefers Oreos.



pecially on Friday. That was really amazing," said Carmen Grimm. She and Mary Zuber chair the Amana Church's Christmas Bazaar at the Amana Church. This annual event raises funds for the Amana Church youth ministry, specifically the summer vacation Bible school, the Sunday School and the youth group program. The Amana Church's annual Prelude Cookie Walk was equally successful and together both raised about \$6,000 for the programs noted above.

The question is often asked, "Did you run out of cookies?" This year every single cookie walk patron was able to choose their own delicious selection of cookies and treats. And when the last patron left, there were only three or four dozen cookies and bars remaining, these were carefully plated for colony residents in nursing facilities or who are ill or recuperating at home. So the answer is; the cookie walk had exactly the right amount of cookies and no cookie went unloved, Jacobson explained to us.

"I don't know when we've had more cookies. . . there was a wonderful variety of cookies too this year. The variety was exceptional. We want to thank every single person who baked," said Amy Jacobson, cookie walk chairperson.

Eastern Iowa Burglaries - Be Wary

lowa County Sheriff Robert Rotter reports that there is a seasonal uptick in the number of burglaries and thefts in eastern lowa.

"The Amanas, for the most part, have been spared from the rampant burglary activities that have plagued eastern lowa. . . I would like to think we will continue to be so lucky, but I doubt it will end that way. The holiday season from mid-November through early January is notorious for high burglary rates," Sheriff Rotter reported via email.

"Burglars wait for the coast to be clear and then move within the shadows," he added.

Sheriff Rotter explained that it is very important that residents be vigilant. Here are his tips.

- Keep an eye on your and your neighbor's property, reporting to Iowa County Law Enforcement "things that don't look right."
- Secure (lock) your cars, homes and out buildings. Remove car keys from the car.
- Use well-placed lights inside and outside your home.
- Motion activated lights are good at repelling burglars.
- If you see a suspicious vehicle in your neighborhood, call law enforcement. Try to get the license plate number and share it with law enforcement.
- Do not confront the suspicious party yourself. Call law enforcement.
