Museum Refurbishment Underway Heritage Builders Hard at Work

Painters and carpenters from Heritage Builders/Perfect Painters out of Ithaca have started with the exterior refurbishment of the Brick Tavern Museum.

With over thirty years experience refurbishing historic properties, Heritage Builders was chosen by the Board of Trustees after a rigorous selection process.

Their mission is to remove flaking paint from old brick, replace any water damaged



wood trim, refurbish window shutters, paint window frames and doors, fix roof flashing, empty and rehang gutters, and point out any other pressing concerns.

The Historical Society at Work Redesigning the Historical Society Journal

Working on the Wedgwood Building Volunteers install new stairs and handicap ramp

The old Wedgwood Schoolhouse on Route 414 in the town of Dix now has a new front door staircase and handicap ramp thanks to Society volunteers.

The Wedgwood building was acquired by the Society from the town of Dix in late 2008 with the eventual intention of converting the building into a rural life/agricultural museum.

With recent funds raised by the 50th Anniversary Capital Campaign and earmarked for the Wedgwood, lumber and other materials were finally purchased for the project. Volunteers David Lisk, Dan Teed, Roy Evans, Bob DeYager, and Museum Director Andrew Tompkins were able to complete the stairs and ramp in one day of hard work.

Next up will be interior sanding and painting!

Freeman Family Foundation Middle School Competition

The Freeman Family Foundation has partnered with the Schuyler County Historical Society to hold the 2011-12 Regional History Competition open to all Watkins Glen Middle School students.

The competition will offer cash rewards for first and second places in the 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade categories and the 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade categories.

For each category first place will be awarded \$150 and second place \$75. There will also be honorable mentions. The classroom of the first place winner in each category will also receive \$25. The purpose of the competition is to promote learning, enhance awareness of, and instill pride in, our regional heritage by providing a competition where individual students compete by creating a presentation (project display) based on local and regional history themes.

The presentation can consist of a chart, display, graph, photo collage, computer-based project (website or Power-Point presentation), or a project agreed upon with the student's teacher.

The next competition will start in October 2011 instead of next Spring. More information will be forthcoming.
