PASTOR'S POST

Sabbatical – A period of time when one does not work at their regular employment and takes a break for rest, travel, or research (Merriam Webster).

Ever since I have served as an ordained minister, I have had the opportunity for a sabbatical (my call agreement at both churches I have served indicates eligibility for a sabbatical after five years of full time ministry). However, I never felt the need or sensed the call to take a sabbatical. That all changed about this same time last year.

I cannot put my finger on a particular reason why, but in the fall of 2018 I began to feel the need for an extended period of time for rest and renewal. The feeling does not come from anything United Church has done. I love my work at United Church!

And yet I sense the need for sabbatical does come from being on call as a parish pastor every day. Every time the phone vibrates, a text comes through, an email pops up in my mailbox or someone comes to the church building; I never know for sure what life experience might need my attention and my presence as pastor. It's a privilege to serve as pastor, but there are demands that go with that service.

In working with the church council and a sabbatical committee appointed by the church council late in 2018, plans have been made and approved for a sabbatical from April 20, 2020 – July 19, 2020. The sabbatical will include time to unwind, hike throughout this beautiful State of Arizona, spend several weeks with family and friends in the Midwest, and then more hiking in Alaska before getting geared up for my return as Senior Pastor of United Church.

We'll plan an ice cream and chocolate cake sabbatical kickoff for Sunday April 19 – Holy Humor Sunday! But before then, in the weeks and months ahead, watch the newsletter and bulletin for additional information or feel free to visit with Moderator Norm Still, Sabbatical Chairperson Pat Dilmore, or me anytime. For now, most of all, please know I am terrifically grateful for this sabbatical opportunity!

Greetings from your Parish Nurse!

About six months ago my sister and I planned a "getaway" together in Williamsburg, VA for mid-September. We didn't make any concrete plans other than our lodging and car rental. For the rest of the trip we decided to "wing it." We ended up having a wonderful, relaxing time with no deadlines and no expectations. We walked, swam, shopped, and brushed up on a little history in the area. We also watched the DVDs for a 6-week Bible Study that a mutual friend had shared with us. I was amazed at how refreshing and revitalizing that time was! Being able to talk honestly, to have quiet time, physical exercise, and just "hanging out" with my sister whom I consider one of my best friends.

One of the reasons it was so meaningful was because I had recently returned from caring for my sister-in-law after surgery where she was diagnosed with breast cancer. Caring for her in this time of need was a bonding experience in our relationship. We were able to cry a bit and laugh a bit, as well as dealing with day to day chores and all the implications that this diagnosis brings. She was very brave and is doing well, though the difficult road ahead seems to be a fairly long one.

I was honored to be able to care for her, and to be a part of her support network, but at the same time, it depleted more energy, physical, spiritual and mental strength than I realized. It was only as I was refreshed in VA that I realized what a toll it had taken.

Many of us are in the role of caregiver, part or fulltime. It is a very important role, and one in which we "rise to the occasion" when needed. But, don't forget that we also need to *nurture* ourselves to replenish our own resources.

Nurturing ourselves is our monthly goal in our work toward RESILENCE. It can mean different things to different individuals. Nurturing ourselves may be going to a concert, or reading a good book with no interruptions. It may be a walk in the outdoors after the rain, or a hike in the mountains. It may be a quiet time at home, or a "getaway" alone or with a close companion. Whatever it is make sure you take time for it. If we ignore our need to refresh and refill our resources, it begins to take a mental, spiritual and physical toll on our bodies and our lives. Don't feel guilty about taking a little time for yourself, but do something that refills you—spirit, mind and body. Enjoy.

- large potatoes, cubed
- 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 1/2 onion, chopped
- salt and pepper, to taste
- 4 tomatillos, husked and quartered
- 1 garlic clove, peeled
- 1 jalapeno pepper, diced
- 1/2 cup fresh cilantro, chopped
- 3 avocados, halved with pits removed
- 10 (6 inch) corn tortillas
