WHEREAS, Mr. Van Hook is due a refund for the first half of 2014 in the amount of \$3,389.07.







**SHERIFF MICHAEL STRADA – RE: PAINTING OF GRAFFITI ON PARSON
ROAD AND NEWTON SWARTSWOOD ROAD**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to accept an offer from Sussex County Sheriff M. Strada to provide a workforce to clean the graffiti off of street signs along Parson Road and Newton-Swartswood Road with paint containing an agent that repels standard paint for the purpose of discouraging future vandalism.

**JESCO, INC. – AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A BID FROM JESCO, INC. IN
THE AMOUNT OF \$87,500.00 TO PURCHASE A NEW BACKHOE**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to authorize the purchase of a new 2014 John Deer Wheel Loader Backhoe from Jesco, Inc., 118, Saint Nicholas Ave., South Plainfield, NJ 07080 for \$87,500.

LAKELAND BANK – RE: BANKING SERVICES PROPOSAL

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she and Township CFO J. Caruso met with representatives from Lakeland Bank to discuss a proposal for banking services. Lakeland Bank matched the terms proposed by another financial institution. In addition, Lakeland Bank

representatives agreed to consider a proposal from Township Administrator E. Klose to sponsor a Taxpayer ID Card, which would allow local residents to accrue credits toward their individual property tax bill annually.

A MOTION was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize an agreement between Hampton Township and Lakeland Bank for Banking Services.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP PUBLIC LAND SALE

Township officials reviewed the results of a Land Sale in Hampton Township that was held on July 28, 2014. Block 507, Lot 1,2,3 and 4 was purchased subject to the buyer obtaining final site plan approval for a minor subdivision on a nearby lot.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to authorize Township Attorney S. Roseman to prepare the Deeds to merge the newly purchased lots with each buyer's contiguous lot. And, to authorize the sale of Block 507, Lot 1,2,3 and 4 subject to the buyer obtaining site plan approval of a minor subdivision on a nearby lot.

JCP&L DONATION TO HAMPTON TOWNSHIP

JCP&L Customer Relations Representative J. Espinosa presented a check in the amount of \$500.00 to Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. on behalf of JCP&L. The donation was made through the First Energy Foundation, which recognizes organizations for their contributions in areas of Fire & Safety, Stem Cell Research, Engineering & Math, and Community Leadership. HTVFR intends to use the funds to sponsor a Delegate's Luncheon, an event scheduled as part of the Annual Sussex County Firemen's Parade festivities.

Committeeman D. Coranoto and Township Administrator E. Klose both praised the efforts made by Ms. J. Espinosa to provide frequent updates from JCP&L during storms/emergencies.

Township officials and HTVFR officials thanked Ms. Espinosa for being in attendance and expressed appreciation for JcP&L's generous donation.

REQUEST FROM BRANCVILLE BOROUGH

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Branchville Borough officials requested that Hampton Township DPW Operator Russell Bellis operate Hampton Township's Street Sweeper in their municipality for a one-day period. DPW Manager D. Bayles informed Township Administrator E. Klose that he has used the services of the Branchville Borough DPW for various projects in Hampton Township. Branchville officials agreed to pay all expenses associated with the one-day service, including replacement of brushes if they are damaged while in their possession.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to honor a request from Branchville Borough to allow Hampton Township DPW Operator Russell Bellis to operate a Street Sweeper in Branchville Borough for a one-day period providing Branchville agrees to pay all expenses associated with the service, including covering the cost of damaged brushes, if necessary.

DISCUSSION

Township Committeeman D. Coranoto stated that the NJDOT is currently designing revisions along Route 206 and Route 94. Certain improvements are not included in the new design. He suggested that township officials write the NJDOT a letter requesting that they extend the existing right turning lane along Route 206 North all the way down to the intersection of Route 94 South. In addition, Committeeman D. Coranoto suggested including a request to add a right

turning lane on Route 94 South to Route 206 North. The job will go out to bid in August or September of 2015 and construction will likely begin in FY 2016.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to write a letter to the New Jersey Department of Transportation requesting they consider extending the right turning lane on Route 206 North to the Route 94 South Intersection, and to also consider constructing a right turning lane from Route 94 South to Route 206 North.

Committeeman T. Dooley stated that Musco Lighting will deliver the fixtures and bulbs for the Mike Biron Field of Dreams Lighting Project on August 11, 2014. The cost of the materials being delivered is \$42,529. Township Committeeman T. Dooley asked Township Administrator E. Klose if she would contact Musco Lighting to let them know they can pick up a check from the Hampton Township Educational Foundation at the Township Municipal Office the day of the delivery.

Committeeman K. Gourlay suggested organizing a subcommittee for the purpose of determining who would take responsibility for certain duties associated with the operation of the new lighting system. Financial responsibility must also be determined.

Township officials considered a variety of possible methods that could be used to determine how to manage the cost of operating the lights. The consensus was to organize a subcommittee once the installation has been completed. In the meantime, Township Administrator E. Klose will research how surrounding municipalities address costs.

Committeeman T. Dooley raised an issue that had been discussed at an earlier Township Committee Meeting regarding Hampton Township conveying the deeds for the Township's fire stations over to Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the last time the matter was discussed, a suggestion was made that perhaps Hampton Township could continue to pay for the cost of Workman's Compensation for HTVFR members and HTVFR would take over the ownership of the fire stations, insurance for the buildings, as well as assume responsibility for maintaining the buildings.

Committeeman T. Dooley and Committeeman K. Gourlay stated they would like to meet with HTVFR officials to discuss the matter further. Committeeman K. Gourlay suggested that officials also review the prioritization of future fire department projects.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that there has been a long-term drainage issue on Forrest Drive in Kemah Lake that must be addressed because due to flooding in the area. In order to make the necessary repair, the township must obtain a drainage easement from the owner of Block 2701 Lot 27.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to authorize Township Attorney S. Roseman to write a letter on behalf of Hampton Township to the owner of Block 2701, Lot 27 stating that there is a drainage issue that must be remediated and request that the homeowner contact his office to discuss the matter further.

TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

Fire Chief D. Korver reported that HTVFR volunteer responded to 153 fire calls year-to-date. HTVFR volunteers have put in a total of 164 man-hours during the month of July.

The bathroom floor at Fire Station #1 is undergoing a renovation. The project will be completed sometime in August.

PUBLIC SESSION

Mr. R. Stevenson, owner of Block 902, Lot 5.02 was present to discuss a decision by the Township Planning Board to deny his application for a minor subdivision. The subdivision would have resulted in two nonconforming lots, therefore, the Township Planning Board denied Mr. Stevenson's application.

At the time, the Planning Board had given Mr. Stevenson an alternative based on a report submitted by Township Engineer H. Pellow. The report stated that the two-nonconforming lots could be reconfigured in to one conforming lot if Mr. Stevenson was willing to deed a small portion of road frontage off Lake Road to Hampton Township. This reconfiguration eliminates the need for a variance.

Township officials, along with Mr. Stevenson, viewed the township tax map to assess his property and discuss the areas in question. After a lengthy discussion, Mr. Stevenson stated that he was satisfied with the recommendation by Township Engineer H. Pellow to create one conforming lot by deeding 8.5 feet of right-of-way along Lake Road to Hampton Township.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to accept a Road Front Easement from Mr. Stevenson along Lake Road on Block 902, Lot 5.02.




