

2019 Position-By-Position "Up/Downs" for all 130 FBS teams!

Since we don't handicap baseball, the summer months give us ample time to go through all 130 FBS teams team with a fine tooth comb for the upcoming college football season.

One of the methods we use in coming up with some initial power ratings for each team are our position-by-position "Up/Downs." Basically, we go through every position of every team and give a value of "-3 to +3" for QBs, RBs, WR/TE, OL, DL, LBs, DBs, Special Teams, Coaches and Intangibles.

A team with a "+3" for a single position means that we have that position power-rated up three points from the previous season. A good example for this year would be Virginia Tech's defensive backs. Last year they lost three starters and then two projected starters were out for the year during the summer. Now this year the entire unit two-deep returns including seven players who have earned starts.

A team with a "-3" for a single position means that we have that position power-rated down three points from the previous season. A good example for this year would be Mississippi State's defensive line. Last year they returned all 4 starters and allowed just 95 rushing yards per game (lowest since 1999). This year they lose all 4 starters including a pair of players that went in the first round of the NFL Draft. Clearly, they are less experienced and far less talented!

With 10 different categories, the maximum value a team can be up or down from the previous season is 30. That +30 or -30 points rarely, if ever, happens and the only example we can give you in the last 10 years of a team

being nearly 4 TD's different (power ratings wise) from the previous season is UCF in 2015. The Knights went 0-12 (-24 ppg) in 2015 following a 9-4 season where they were +9 ppg. We had them power-rated 27 points lower by the end of the season. The next closest was Louisville last year who went from 8-5 in 2017 (+11 ppg) to 2-10 (-24 ppg) in 2018. We had them power-rated down about 24 points from the beginning of the season.

Below are our "Up/Downs" for every position on every team. For the coach's category (CCH), new coaches can sometimes be downgraded because they are new to that program and don't know the strengths and weaknesses of the players yet. Also they could be installing new schemes on offense and/or defense and the current players might not fit their styles of play (see Georgia Tech going away from the option offense).

Finally, the intangibles category covers a broad range of categories including Close Wins/Losses from the previous year, Strength of Schedule (is it weaker or stronger from last year?), Turnovers, Offensive and Defensive Yards per point, etc. A team like Georgia Southern was graded "-2.5" in that category because they benefited from 3 wins by 7 points or less last year, were +22 in TO's and were actually out-gained in conference play by 19 ypg despite a 6-2 record.

As you can see Louisville, Florida St and Virginia Tech who were all off historically bad seasons have the highest "plus" grades. Massachusetts with only 8 starters back and lose their top 2 passers, top 3 rushers, top 2 tacklers and an All-American at WR in Andy Isabella are at the bottom of the chart.

Ranking and Grading the New College Head Coaching Hires of 2019

We evaluated prior head coaching experience, familiarity with the school and surrounding recruiting area while also taking into consideration the state of the program and realistically, who they could have hired in their current state of affairs.

- Hugh Freeze, Liberty.** These rankings are all about "on the field" and the reality is Freeze was 49-27 SU and remarkably 47-28-1 ATS in his six years as head coach at Arkansas St and Ole Miss. This was big coup for a Liberty program. **Grade: A**
- Neal Brown, West Virginia.** Brown went 35-16 SU the last 4 years at Troy including 3 straight double-digit win seasons. While WV will take a step back in 2019, we think Brown could be an upgrade over Dana Holgorsen. **Grade: A-**
- Scott Satterfield, Louisville.** While Cardinals' fans wanted Jeff Brohm, Louisville got the next best thing as Satterfield went 51-24 SU the last 6 years at Appalachian St building them into one of the better Group of 5 programs. **Grade: A-**
- Manny Diaz, Miami, FL.** While he has no prior head coaching experience, we couldn't think of a better fit for the Miami program. Diaz (son of a former Miami mayor) has been the D.C. here the last 3 years and brought the Miami swag back with the invention of the "turnover chain." **Grade: B+**
- Jim McElwain, Central Michigan.** McElwain was 44-28 SU at Colorado St and Florida from 2012-2017 winning a pair of SEC East titles. While he had a weird ending in Florida, this is a big name hire for a MAC program. **Grade: B+**
- Mike Houston, East Carolina.** Houston was 37-6 SU the last three years at FCS James Madison including a National Championship in 2016. Houston is familiar with the area and should be an upgrade over Scottie Montgomery. **Grade: B+**
- Dana Holgorsen, Houston.** Obviously, Houston made a big splash bringing in Holgorsen from West Virginia where he was 61-41 the last 8 years. Holgorsen was the O.C. here in 2008-09 but was only 38-50-1 ATS his last 7 years. **Grade: B**
- Geoff Collins, Georgia Tech.** Collins is from Georgia and coached here prior as an assistant. He went 15-10 at Temple the last two years. Still this could be a slow build moving away from Paul Johnson's option offense. **Grade: B**
- Jamey Chadwell, Coastal Carolina.** Chadwell has been at Coastal Carolina the last 3 years having served as the interim head coach in 2017 (3-9). He was 35-14 SU in 4 years as head coach at Charleston Southern. **Grade: B**
- Will Healy, Charlotte.** Healy is only 34 years old, but he did a great job at FCS Austin Peay the last 3 years as he led them to a 8-4 record in 2017 after they were arguably the worst FCS program going only 1-45 SU in 2013-16. **Grade: B**
- Chris Klieman, Kansas St.** Klieman comes in from North Dakota St where he went 69-6 SU the last 5 years with four FCS National Championships. He has big shoes to fill taking over for Bill Snyder but is familiar with the region. **Grade: B**
- Ryan Day, Ohio St.** Obviously, Day has prior experience in Columbus having served as the interim coach for the first three games of 2018 (OSU went 3-0). However, Day had no prior head coaching experience to those games and expectations are extremely high (the last 5 OSU head coaches are Hall of Famers). **Grade: B-**
- Rod Carey, Temple.** Carey did a solid job at Northern Illinois going 52-30 but was 0-6 in bowl games. Still, Temple was put in a bad spot after Manny Diaz left them after only a few weeks on the job. **Grade: B-**
- Matt Wells, Texas Tech.** Wells went 44-34 SU in 6 years at Utah St and his best season came last year (10-2). Still, Wells entered 2018 on a bit of a hot seat (3 straight losing seasons) and he doesn't have big ties to Texas. **Grade: B-**
- Gary Andersen, Utah St.** Andersen returns after serving as the head coach here from 2009-2012 including an 11-2 record his final year. However, each of his last two stops (Wisconsin and Oregon St) have not ended well. **Grade: B-**
- Les Miles, Kansas.** Miles is a big-time name having gone 142-55 in 16 years at Oklahoma St and LSU from 2001-2016 highlighted by a National Title in 2007. However, he was fired at LSU and has an even tougher task here. **Grade: B-**
- Mack Brown, North Carolina.** Brown returns to Chapel Hill where he was the head coach from 1988-1997 (69-46-1). Brown went on to coach Texas for 16 years highlighted by a National Championship in 2005. However, he fell out of favor in Austin his last few years and he hasn't coached since 2013. **Grade: B-**
- Tom Arth, Akron.** Arth does have ties to the area having played and coached at Division III John Carroll (Cleveland area) from 2013-16 (went 40-8) but was only 9-13 at FCS Chattanooga the last couple of years. **Grade: B-**
- Eli Drinkwitz, Appalachian St.** While Drinkwitz has no prior head coaching experience, he's familiar with the area having been the O.C. at N.C. State the last 3 years and inherits a very experienced team. **Grade: B-**
- Chip Lindsey, Troy.** Lindsey was the QB coach here in 2010 and has been the O.C. at Southern Miss, Arizona St and Auburn the last 5 years. **Grade: B-**
- Jake Spavital, Texas St.** Spavital has been the O.C. at Texas A&M, California and West Virginia the last 6 years and is familiar with the area. **Grade: B-**
- Mike Locksley, Maryland.** Locksley has familiarity with the program as he was the OC here from 2012-15 and also served as the interim in 2015 (1-5 SU). He was the OC at Alabama last year but we can't get over his overall 3-31 record as a head coach (also at New Mexico from 2009-11). **Grade: C+**
- Mel Tucker, Colorado.** Tucker has been around a long-time at both the College and Pro levels (most recently as Georgia's DC the last 3 years) and finally gets his chance as a head coach. Still he doesn't have ties to the area. **Grade: C+**
- Tyson Helton, Western Kentucky.** Helton has no prior head coaching experience but was the O.C. here in 2014-15. He was the O.C. at Tennessee last year and was at USC in 2016-17 as the QB's coach. **Grade: C+**
- Scot Loeffler, Bowling Green.** Loeffler has been an O.C. at Temple, Auburn, Virginia Tech and Boston College but has no prior head coaching experience. We do not like his D.C. hire of Brian VanGorder. **Grade: C**
- Walt Bell, Massachusetts.** This is Bell's first head coaching gig and he has no other ties to the area having coached in the South his entire career. He was the O.C. at Maryland and Florida St the last 3 years. **Grade: C**
- Thomas Hammock, Northern Illinois.** Hammock was a RB here from 1999-2002 and was also the RB's coach in 2005-06. However, he's never been even a coordinator before and comes from the NFL. **Grade: C**

Top 5 Most Improved Teams in College Football Entering 2019

Last Year's Top 5 Went from 14-45 in '17 to 33-29 in '18

1. Nebraska (4-8 SU/7-5 ATS in 2018)

Returning Starters: 13 (7 offense, 6 defense)

2019 Recruiting Class Rank: #18

It was a rough beginning to head coach Scott Frost's first year in Lincoln. The Huskers started off 0-6 for the first time in school history, but they improved dramatically in their final six games going 4-2 SU/5-1 ATS. Nebraska went from getting out-scored by 15 ppg in the first six games to out-scoring their opponents by 13 ppg in their final six. This year Nebraska welcomes back 13 starters led by QB Adrian Martinez who had 3,246 total yards and 25 total TD's as a true freshman. The schedule also sets up nicely as Nebraska avoids Michigan, Michigan St and Penn St from the Big Ten East Division and they host Iowa, Ohio St, Northwestern and Wisconsin. After losing five games by a TD or less in 2018, we think the Huskers at least double their season win total from a year ago.



2. UCLA (3-9 SU/5-6-1 ATS in 2018)

Returning Starters: 19 (9 offense, 10 defense)

2019 Recruiting Class Rank: #40

Chip Kelly's first season in "La La Land" was one to forget as the Bruins started off 0-5 for the first time since 1943. However, the Bruins did show improvement especially on offense in the latter part of the season averaging 486 ypg on offense in their final 4 games (only 346 ypg in the first 8). This year the Bruins welcome back a nation-high 19 starters led by RB Joshua Kelly (1,243 rush yards last year). Despite playing one of the toughest schedules in the country, we think the Bruins can at least double their season win total in 2019.



3. Arkansas (2-10 SU/5-7 ATS in 2018)

Returning Starters: 12 (6 offense, 6 defense)

2019 Recruiting Class Rank: #23

It was a season to forget for first-year head coach Chad Morris in 2018 as the Razorbacks lost 10 games for the first time in school history. However, they were better than that record indicated as they lost four games by a TD or less. This year they are in much better shape as they bring in a couple of transfers at QB in Ben Hicks (all-time passing leader in SMU history) and Nick Starkel (was at Texas A&M). This year's non-conference schedule will see Arkansas favored by double-digits in all four games and we think they can pull one upset in SEC play which would mean a 3-win improvement.



4. Florida St (5-7 SU/4-8 ATS in 2018)

Returning Starters: 16 (8 offense, 8 defense)

2019 Recruiting Class Rank: #19

Last year was a disastrous first season for head coach Willie Taggart as the Seminoles suffered their first losing season since 1976 (Bobby Bowden's first in Tallahassee!). The Noles' offense only averaged 21.9 ppg (since 1981) and the defense allowed a school record 31.5 ppg. This season the Seminoles are in much better shape as they return 16 starters and the player's have bought in. We would favor this year's FSU team by at least a TD over last year's team and we think they could win eight games or so (3-win improvement).



5. Virginia Tech (6-7 SU/6-7 ATS in 2018)

Returning Starters: 16 (6 offense, 10 defense)

2019 Recruiting Class Rank: #26

Last year the Hokies suffered their first losing season since 1992! This year, the arrow looks to be pointing way up with the return of 16 starters including 10 on a defense that was ravaged by injury and inexperience a year ago. On offense, they welcome back QB Ryan Willis who had 3,070 total yards and 28 total TD's last year. The schedule also sets up nicely as they avoid the top four teams from the ACC Atlantic Division (Clemson, Florida St, Syracuse and NC State) and they play a pair of FCS teams in non-conference. We think the Hokies could win as many as 9 games this season (3-win improvement).



Honorable Mention (Last year's HM went 23-40 SU in '17 to 32-30 SU in '18):

Central Michigan (1-11 SU/5-7 ATS in 2018)-Last year the Chippewas suffered their worst season in school history but things are looking up in 2019 thanks to new head coach Jim McElwain. We think CMU could top last year's win total by Week 3 (home games vs Albany and Akron).

Air Force (5-7 SU/6-4-2 ATS in 2018)-The Falcons are flying under the radar after back-to-back losing seasons but this year's team welcomes back 14 starters and we think they will win at least 7 games.

Tennessee (5-7 SU/5-7 ATS in 2018)-After a somewhat disappointing first season under head coach Jeremy Pruitt, the Volunteers welcome back 16 returning starters including 10 on offense. Pruitt also signed a Top 15 recruiting class and we think Tennessee improves by a couple of wins this season.

Florida Atlantic (5-7 SU/3-8-1 ATS in 2018)-After winning 11 games in year one under head coach Lane Kiffin, the Owls were a huge disappointment last year. This year, we think they contend for the CUSA crown.

North Carolina (2-9 SU/6-5 ATS in 2018)-The Tar Heels welcome back 14 starters from a team that was much better than their 2-9 record last year (lost 5 games by a TD or less). We're not highly overly optimistic about new head coach Mack Brown (see left) but this team is capable of doubling their win total from last year.

- 1. Purdue UNDER 7.5 Wins (-130).** While we like head coach Jeff Brohm, this is a tall task for the Boilers who have only won 6 games in the regular season the last two years. Purdue might be only in favored in 5 games (Nevada, Vanderbilt, Maryland, Illinois and Indiana) and will have to win several toss-up games.
- 2. Cincinnati OVER 6.5 Wins (-135).** Last year the Bearcats won 10 games in the regular season and this year's team looks just as good with 14 returning starters. Cincy could be favored in as many as 10 games with their only clear underdog roles coming at Ohio St and Memphis.
- 3. Ohio OVER 7.5 Wins (-114).** The Bobcats have won at least 8 games in four straight seasons and they return their best player in QB Nathan Rourke. The Bobcats could be favored in as many as 10 games this season with their only clear underdog roles coming at Pitt and Marshall.

- 4. Colorado UNDER 4.5 Wins (-108).** The Buffs only return 11 starters and have a new head coach. They pull the four toughest teams from the Pac-12 North and could be only favored in two games (Colorado St and Air Force).
- 5. Marshall OVER 7 Wins (-125).** The Herd have topped this season win total in 5 of the last 6 years. They welcome back 14 starters and they could be favored in as many as 9 games this year (only dog roles at Boise, vs Cincy and at FAU).
- 6. USF UNDER 7.5 Wins (-130).** We're not overly high on USF head coach Charlie Strong and the Bulls could be favored in only 6 games this year.
- 7. UCLA OVER 5.5 Wins (-108).** UCLA returns a nation-high 19 starters this year and the Bruins are much improved in year two under head coach Chip Kelly. Despite playing a tough schedule, we think they double their win total from last year.
- 8. Texas UNDER 9.5 Wins (-145).** We feel the Horns are one of the most overrated teams in the country entering 2019. They return a nation-low 8 starters from a team that won 9 regular season games last year but remember 6 of those were by a TD or less. The Horns will only be clear favorites in 7 games this year.
