What is America250?

- celebrating 250 years of independence
- semiquincentennial or "semiquin" for short
- a broad flexible multi-year commemoration
- the largest and most inclusive celebration in our country's history
- The commemoration period began in 2020, culminates on July 4, 2026, and officially concludes in 2027





A cobranded public-private partnership

- U.S. Semiquincentennial Commission
 - Public Law 114-196
 - 16 private citizens as Commissioners, along with four U.S Representatives and four U.S. Senators

America 250 Foundation, Inc.

• 26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3)

 a Type II – 509(a)(3) supporting organization supervised or controlled by the Commission through majority board representation



State partners support

- America250 Foundation support for official 'state partners:'
 - America250 brand marks;
 - Organizational support;
 - National convenings to share best practices and strategy;
 - Grants of \$10,000 to support states and territories in the early stages of their commission buildout.






Progress in 2021 towards 2023

- Eighteen states have created commissions:
- Alabama, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska, New Jersey, North Carolina, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, and West Virginia.
- Three states Kansas, New York, and Wisconsin – are in the process of commission formation.

Enabling legislation

Model legislation -- 2017 bicentennial legislation
 2009 Miss. Laws Ch. 418 (S.B. 2875)

- Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House
- Each to have designee and three appointees each of the Mississippi Supreme Court districts
- Lt. Governor--one appointee from the industrial community
- Speaker—one Native American appointee
- Plus two members appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History
- Plus the Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History





Enabling legislation

Issues to consider with the 2017 model:

- additional at-large appointees for Governor, Lt. Governor
 & Speaker
- creation of special fund in state treasury
- include Mississippi Development Authority Tourism Division
- per diem compensation rate for legislators, state officials or state employees
- **o non-legislative member compensation**
- check the box" Mississippi Bicentennial Celebration Fund
