DRESSAGE RULE CHANGE

The FEI Rule which states that horses are not permitted to compete in FEI events "if the horse's sensory hairs have been clipped and/or shaven or in any other way removed unless individual sensory hairs have been removed by a veterinarian to prevent pain or discomfort for the horse," will now also apply to all EA National Disciplines.

There will be a transition period from now until 1st January 2022, when the rule will come into full effect. No elimination or penalty will be incurred during the transition period.

Dressage Judge Activities Update

Congratulations

During 2021 we have had a number of Judges upgrading during the year and it's great to see this progress. Congratulations to Kirsty Stuart and Carly Boon who both passed their Judge exam upgrades to Elementary, to Janene Clark who has upgraded to Medium and to Tamsin Adcock who upgraded to Advanced. Welcome to Kaitlin Petney as a new G level Judge and also to two new fast-track Judges at F and working towards E - well done to Cheryl Hatswell and Phoebe Foulkes.

Judge Education Seminars

For 2021, the last seminar to be held is for re-accreditation of Para Judges and it will a Zoom virtual seminar on Friday evening 29th October. We will have Sue Cunningham as our Judge Educator and she will show videos and host discussion from the Dressage competition at the Tokyo Olympics Para-Equestrian Games. This Zoom session is open to anyone interested and would count as a workshop for non-Para Judges. If you are interested, contact the Judge email to register: dressagejudge@equestriansa.com.au

Planning for Judges' seminars in 2022 has progressed as far as setting dates. We are watching the COVID situation Interstate while we try to assess who can be invited from where, as a Judge Educator. Remember that riders and spectators are welcome to attend any of the Judge education seminars. They are a great opportunity to learn what Judges can see and how marks are awarded.

Rule Change

G-level Zoom Call

In September, the Judges' Committee hosted a zoom call for G and F level Judges. The session was held to help new Judges understand the requirements and processes to become a Judge, or upgrade to the next level. It also gave Judges a chance to discuss what practical experience they need, and to get help finding a mentor for shadow judging and exams.

The session was well received by everyone. We are planning to hold more of these sessions to help interested people become Judges.

2022 National Championships

The 2022 Australian Dressage Championships are being held at Boneo Park in October. This and other Interstate events would be a great opportunity for Judges to gain experience shadow judging or sitting exams for upgrading. Start planning now and make use of the Subsidy Scheme to support your development. A reminder of the Scheme is detailed below.

South Australian Judges Subsidy Scheme

The ESA Dressage Judges' Committee (ESA-DJC) recognises that to maintain accreditation, upgrade qualifications or gain further experience, Judges may need to travel Interstate. As this can be costly, the ESA-DJC have allocated funds from the SA Dressage Judge levy collected by Clubs, to support Judges travelling for further education.

The purpose of the Subsidy Scheme is to set out a framework to reimburse South Australian Judges travelling Interstate (and across regions) to upgrade, remain accredited or further their judging experience. It will apply to any expenses incurred from 30th November 2019 to 30th June 2020 and during the financial year starting 1st July 2020. This will be continued for the financial year starting 1st July 2021.

The amounts noted in this document are intended as a guide only. Funding is subject to availability and will be reviewed as part of normal financial operations. For any financial year, a cap of \$3,000 will apply. The ESA-JSC will review all applications and approve those that meet the criteria and intention described below and are within the available budget.

For subsidies numbered 1-3, funding is limited to 5 Judges per year. A Judge may only apply for one subsidy per financial year. Judges must check with the Committee if funds are available before travelling.

Please note:

Judges maintaining accreditation or upgrading are encouraged to seek Judging appointments Interstate and then 'piggyback' attending a Seminar or undertaking shadow judging or sit-ins. Organising Committees may pay for at least part of airfares and accommodation and this then stretches our budget further and allows for more Judges to benefit from the scheme.

1. Upgrading to A or B Level

Judges upgrading to A or B Level may receive a subsidy of \$1000 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

2. Upgrading to C or D Level

Judges upgrading to C or D Level may receive a subsidy of \$500 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

3. Gaining further experience in judging Interstate

To encourage Judges to travel Interstate to see different horses and gain further experience in judging, a subsidy of \$200 (max per Judge per level) will be paid for these Judges to pencil for higher level Judges, shadow judge or sit-in at an Interstate event. The event and activity must be appropriate to the applicant's current or upgrading level. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

4. Regional Judge Support

The ESA-DJC understands that for Judges in regional areas, the cost to attend seminars, workshops and shadow judging can be prohibitive. Judges travelling in excess of 120 km (each way) from home to a venue to shadow judge at a competition or attend a seminar for the purpose of maintaining accreditation or upgrading, may receive a subsidy of \$0.50 per kilometre up to a maximum of \$250. Shared driving is encouraged where practical. Potential Judges who are travelling to attend a G-level seminar or a competition for the purpose of shadow judging may apply for reimbursement when they are appointed as a G-level Judge, at the completion of all the requirements. Regional Judges may submit one application per year.

Dressage Judges Sub-Committee Report - September 2021 The Impact of COVID-19 Restrictions on Dressage Judge Education During 2020 and 2021

From the point of view of Dressage Judges / Officials education, COVID lockdown in Australia has quickly stimulated much more on-line learning than was previously endorsed by EADOC. Various State JSCs including the SA-JSC have been pushing for this for a number of years to allow more flexibility and opportunity for education, especially for Regional Judges and also for time-poor Judges in the central areas. This has been welcome progress over 2020 and 2021. In South Australia, we had to cancel Judge Seminars in 2020 but there was no financial impact as deposits or airfares were not paid. In planning for 2021 we were by then more aware of possible problems and for the Education Seminars held we were careful to plan to use more of our local Judge Educators and not rely solely on Interstate visitors. In 2021 we were lucky that we managed to cover all levels, including an "A" level Seminar with an FEI JE from Queensland in May, without any cancelled Seminars.

We still have a Para-Dressage Judge Seminar required for reaccreditation of our Para Judges, but fortunately EADOC has approved an on-line format for this. We have a Para Judge Educator booked for a ZOOM seminar on the evening of Oct 29th. Sue Cunningham has recently judged at the Para Olympics in Tokyo and will be showing tests for discussion from that event. This will be an incredible opportunity to see and discuss horses from this International forum whereas in other times we would have been required to use local Parariders in a live format. The cost is also reduced as there are no airfares or accommodation costs for the Judge Educator.

While keeping up with accreditation has been possible, it has been extremely difficult for upgrading Judges to shadow judge and sit-in at competitions and therefore many have not been able to progress at the pace they had hoped. For example, we had two SA Judges provided with funding from a Victorian club to travel to Werribee for training in July, but this was cancelled at the last minute as their return to SA could not be planned, due to the sudden Victorian COVID lockdown. Many major Dressage events in Australia have been cancelled and these are the vital events for Judges to train at, due to the numbers and quality of horses and Judge Educators attending. Local events have proceeded but without Interstate Judges to help with education. With only ten local Mentors it is not always possible to help everyone who is applying for shadow-judging and sitins. Yet we need more Judges to upgrade to increase the number of Mentors!

In summary, the advance in technology during COVID lockdowns has been welcome, but the loss of live competition training opportunities has been a negative.

In 2022 there will be two types of entries into the HOTY Awards, allowing riders to choose how they will participate in HOTY in 2022. There will be two types of entries:

1. Standard HOTY - entry is free. Entry:

 will put the combination into the running for the Annual HOTY Awards that are presented at the ESA Awards night;

2. Gold HOTY - Has a \$22 inc GST administration fee. Entry:

- will put the combination into the running for the Annual HOTY Awards that are presented at the ESA Awards Night
- give riders with multiple horses free Gold HOTY entry for any additional horses
- give riders early ticket sales on DSA run events
- give riders discounted entry to DSA run events
- allow the opportunity to participate in HOTY Training events on/off horse
- receive communication from DSA about upcoming events/changes/ opportunities
- riders receive a discount to State Dressage Championships entries
- will provide a review for possible automatic invitation to be selected for the Foundations for the Future Squad.

Tribute To A Champion

Euroz Jinks (or Jazz as he was known to his friends), was a Dressage champion and much loved family member. His journey with young rider Nicole Berry began over five years ago when Leon Berry, Nicole's father, discovered his For Sale advert in the horse feed section in Aushorse.

Since the formation of their partnership, Jazz and Nicole consistently dominated the Young Rider Dressage scene within SA and Interstate. The pair were members of the SA State Squads, from the Young Rider Squad through to senior FEI as they moved up the ranks from Elementary to Small Tour. Additionally, Jazz and Nicole were recipients of the Jackman



Trelor Perpetual Trophy in 2016 (awarded to the SA Youth Elementary Champion), the Eyre Peninsula Dressage Club SA Advanced Champion Trophy in 2017 and the South Australian Dressage Association Intermediate I Trophy in 2018. Nicole and Jazz also achieved performance medals at Medium, Advanced and Small Tour level. With countless wins and achievements throughout the levels, a few of their notable accolades are:

While Jazz was a champion Dressage horse in the arena, at home and around the stables he was known to be a quirky, funny and unique character. He could often be seen spooking at invisible monsters during the warm up, but also be seen being led by Nicole's dog Cody and even giving Cody the occasional pony ride. It is safe to say that there will never be another Jazz for Nicole. On behalf of the dressage SA community, we would like to acknowledge Jazz's contribution to our sport and offer condolences to the Berry family during this time.

Medical Exemption Cards In Dressage

From time to time competitors may notice other riders making variations or small modifications in their tests or in their gear.

The EA Exemption scheme provides exemption to EA Dressage Rules for riders who are current members of Equestrian Australia and have an identified diagnosed disability or impairment supported by medical documentation.

Variations can be along the lines of rising trot, where the test specifies sitting, carrying two whips when the rules specify one, different strapping on the saddle or riders who can take a break part way through their test. The exemptions are varied and are very specific to the individual rider and their abilities.

Medical Exemption Cards In Dressage (Cont'd)

Something to be aware of is that many disabilities or impairments are not visible. They can be short term as a rider recovers from injury and while they are able to ride, they may be unable to physically carry out all the requirements of a test at the level they were previously riding. It could be long term or short term, relating to illness or injury, some physical conditions are progressive so there are times a rider will require their exemption to vary as their condition changes over time.

To receive a Medical Exemption riders must have an Exemption Application Form filled out by a Medical Professional and must also be sent on to Danielle O'Brien at EA.

Once the application is received by EA, all information will be forwarded to the EA Exemption Committee for consideration. The rider is then notified by EA in writing if approved or not approved.

Upon approval by the Committee the rider will be issued with an EA Exemption Card for use in Dressage competitions run

under EA National Rules only. Exemption cards for compensatory aids do not apply to Young Horse competitions however test calling in Young Horse competitions will be permitted for riders with the appropriate exemption card. The Exemption Card will list the exemptions/ special equipment permitted and a 'Valid to' date up to a maximum of four years. A copy of the Exemption Card must be provided to the OC at the time of entry and should be carried by the rider at the Competition.

How are the upgrading points calculated?

Article 4.9.1 of the rule book sets out how upgrading points are calculated . In relation to the awarding of points:

- a) upgrading points are awarded for ALL Official Competitive competitions, including Youth competitions (with the exception of Freestyle, Young Horse and Participation competitions), regardless of any restrictions (e.g. age and breed of horse, etc)
- b) upgrading points are awarded based on % only regardless of placing
- c) points gained are determined as:
 - between 61% to 62.999% = 1 point
 - between 63% to 64.999% = 2 points
 - between 65% to 66.999% = 3 points
 - between 67% to 68.999% = 4 points
 - between 69% to 70.999% = 5 points
 - between 71% to 72.999% = 6 points
 - 73% and over = 7 points

When do you need to upgrade?

Horses from Preliminary to Advanced are upgraded when they receive Upgrade points in the level(s) above what they are graded. If you want to know what your horse is graded at you can do a quick horse search on the EA website: https://www.equestrian.org.au/members/search/horse. In Official Competitive competitions the following criteria apply at the closing date of entries (see table below):

Graded level Eligibility of Horses and Ponies for each level

Preliminary / Novice	Horses/ponies with less than 40 upgrading points gained in Elementary and above
Elementary	Horses/ponies with less than 40 upgrading points gained in Medium and above
Medium	Horses/ponies with less than 40 upgrading points gained in Advanced and above
Advanced	Horses/ponies with less than 30 upgrading points gained in FEI competitions

When it comes to FEI horses they are no longer upgraded using points but rather through a qualification process. Below is a table listing what qualifications are needed to move to the different FEI levels. For more information see Equestrian Australia Dressage Rules article 4.8.3.2.

Prix St Georges and Intermediate I tests including FEI Young Rider tests	Combinations must have achieved 60% or above on two occasions in Official Advanced competitions to be eligible to compete PSG, Intermediate 1. In the event that the competitions are held at the one event, they must be judged by a different panel of Judges
Intermediate A and B	Combinations must have gained at least 60% in an Official Intermediate I competition to compete in Intermediate A and B or Intermediate II
Intermediate II and EA Grand Prix, including U25 Grand Prix	Combinations must have gained 60% on two occasions in Intermediate A, B or Intermediate II to be eligible to compete Grand Prix and U25 Grand Prix. For GP CDNs held in conjunction with FEI Sanctioned events see Rule 4.8.3.i)



FOCUS ON

Mid South East Dressage Club

In this edition we will put the focus on the Mid South East Dressage Club who have just run the Raidis Estate SA Dressage Country Classic. Thank you to the MSEDC for supplying this article.

An open meeting was held on the 23rd August 1983 to form a regional Dressage Club. Some 60 people attended and a Committee was formed. Initially 34 Senior Members and 4 Junior Members joined. It was originally titled the Southeast Dressage Club but when applying for Incorporation another group at Mt Gambier applied for a similar name, so the Naracoorte Club then became The Mid South East Dressage Club Inc



The first event was a training day on the 23rd of September 1983 at which the then President of the SADA, Mr Marian Malecki, instructed 12 riders and 34 spectators attended. The Club conducted its first Dressage competition on the 18th December 1983. The membership has fluctuated over the years but currently remains stable around the 80 mark.

In 1993 the Club approached EFA SA to ask how to garner more support and attention from them. They were advised to hold a competition! So, the Club held its first 2-day Competition over the Easter weekend, named the Naracoorte Dressage Spectacular and it proved to be very popular in the SA and Victorian Dressage community.

By 2000, a lack of members and a change of Committee saw the date and title changed to a Claytons Championship, held in February. The change of date clashed with too many Southeast Events and it proved to be not so popular.

In 2003 the Club was in a precarious position due to the hike in insurance premiums and a downturn in membership. There was a need to raise more funds or the Club would be disbanded. Hence a Winter Series was introduced to encourage all equestrians in the region to become involved and find out if there would be enough support to promote and rebuild the Club. This idea was instigated by Susan Thornley to boost a depleting membership, offering a monthly Come And Try competition at different venues in the region. It was a very successful idea, with people coming out of the woodwork to experience Dressage in a non-pressure environment, encompassing all horse types and riders. The first Winter Series was spawned and has continued each year since.

Susan continued to introduce many innovative ideas to continue to attract more members. The boost of

enthusiasm revamped the 2-day Championship event to a new date over the April Anzac long weekend and the event was renamed the SA Country Dressage Championships. It was a prestigious event on the SA Calendar in its day, also attracting competitors from Victoria. An SA / Vic challenge trophy was created to promote more entries and friendly banter between competitors. The event became a holiday weekend away, many families camping, Dads doing day trips from the grounds, site-seeing, children playing games and joining in on treasure hunts. Innovative prizes for lucky camping spots, lucky seat prizes etc., added to a fun weekend. There were even fuel discount cards for all competitors to help with their costs for travelling. The competition was serious though, with the Club spending considerable funds to provide up to 10 Interstate Judges to preside.

The 2004 Country Champs introduced a Dawn Service on horseback, with competitors and a Minister attending in military uniforms of soldiers past on horseback. Competitors added to the atmosphere of the weekend with Freestyle Pas de Deux with military uniforms and music.

In 2005 the club was nominated for an SA Great Award.

The club moved into the IT world with a web page and email. Regular articles were published in the local papers, there were local radio interviews and a live interview during the Champs on Adelaide radio, articles and results in



the Sunday Mail and publication in two National magazines. There was successful TV coverage both at the event and as a sporting interest report. Interviews on local TV News of FEI riders and Interstate Dressage Instructors kept the Club in the public eye.

Again, more ideas brought to fruition a purpose-built trailer to carry and protect arenas, a first aid kit for horse and humans, signs, tools, arena letters etc., a mobile competition in a trailer which could be also hired to other organisations e.g. Show societies and Horse Trials to run Dressage competitions. All this innovation allowed the Club to improve its ability to continue to be foremost in the State with activities. It was the first Club to introduce Computer Scoring with a Dressage Competition specific program. To this day I doubt finding one so comprehensive and easy to use.



FOCUS ON

Mid South East Dressage Club

A bus trip to the SA State Dressage Championships was well supported too, giving members more insight to where they could aim for.

The enthusiasm felt within the Committee during these years could fill a football stadium.

In 2007-2008 year EA's CEO Angela Yeend and Wend Hunt, Chairperson of the State Dressage Committee held a meeting with the MSEDC committee asking if the Club would hold the SA State Dressage Championships. After much discussion the Committee agreed to give it a go. MSEDC was the first Club to take on the responsibility for this event and it would be the first time the event would be held regionally. Despite the many hurdles it was a resounding success.

Again, the Club was approached during the EI dramas and agreed to hold the event once again despite all the added

The Club has also designed and introduced Tiny Tot Dressage Tests at four Levels to include the family element. This is most appreciated by the young Mums in the Club and there is cuteness overload with toddlers on gorgeous ponies.

Club Freestyle days, include novelty costumes, Freestyles with planned music and design, as well as riding an EA test to your favourite music, and a popular Christmas Party on horseback. Promoting so much fun.

Affiliation with HRCAV: the Club saw a need to encourage and include riders from the region who were intimidated by EA competition, costs and rule requirements and therefore affiliation with the HRCAV from Victoria fulfilled an inclusive opportunity to keep member numbers up in a sparse

population. Many of those who begin in HRCAV quickly gain confidence to progress to EA.

Sadly MSEDC does not have its own grounds but the upside is the Club is in the enviable position to be able to seasonally use the Naracoorte Pony Club Grounds, the Naracoorte P&A Society Show Grounds, the Naracoorte Polocrosse Grounds and over the years the Lucindale Hockey Grounds.

The Club's newsletter, produced each month, is the fabric to keep all the members informed and encouraged over a wide landscape stretching through two States. It also holds a historical record.

Many of the innovative ideas and thinking out of the box encouragement ideas have been influenced by Susan Thornley, who attends Clubs meetings in Adelaide and strongly advocates at Regional Judges Seminars plus an extensive list of many more ideas, along with the can-do dedicated Secretaries Amanda Lock and Kristy Boord and as Susan will attest, cohesive and hardworking Committees over the years, that makes this Club such a regional success.

biosecurity responsibilities. After all the work had been completed at the eleventh hour, the restrictions were lifted and a smooth, happy event took place regardless.

Again in 2011 the Club held yet another State Championship event and the advent of Freestyles held under lights in the evening. A cool misty night brought a ghostly picture to one remarkable Freestyle done to the haunting music of the bagpipes, along with many others.

DRESSAGE SA 2022 FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE SQUADS DOCUMENT



Purpose

Dressage South Australia (DSA) is committed to encouraging, training and developing combinations through the levels towards SA's High Performance Squad and National competitions. The purpose of the "Dressage South Australia Foundations for the Future Squads" is to recognise talented combinations within the different categories of DSA riders and create Squads to develop them. DSA's aim is to encourage Dressage riders to reach their highest potential through forming a community of riders who can support each other as they strive for improved performance and better outcomes through training.

The foundations for the Future Squads

- will have express entry to on and off-horse training programs
- successful Squad applicants will be listed in Moving Forward, on the DSA Facebook page and website
- will be provided with a saddle cloth badge
- may be asked to be demonstration riders for Judges' clinics and Master Classes
- will have access to pre-sale tickets to attend Master Classes as spectators before opening to the general public
- will have the opportunity to attend Judges' update sessions.

Qualifying

General qualification process

- Squad selection will be based on the performance of the rider/horse combination from the preceding calendar competition year
- Squads are open to all competitive combinations but riders must be Australian citizens and current financial members of Equestrian South Australia. The horses and riders must reside in South Australia
- should there be more applications than places, an average of the three highest submitted percentages will be used to determine the successful combinations by the selectors
- Squad riders are role models for the sport and must abide by the Equestrian Australia Codes of Conduct, Social Media Policy and the principals for the Welfare of the Horse. This is essential for all positions on the Squads

Criteria and Scores

- the highest average of three scores will be used to determine which combinations receive priority
- this will be the highest three scores (can be over multiple levels) obtained between 1/1/21 and 31/12/2021 with no less than two Judges for each test
- a minimum of two out of the three scores must be from SA HOTY competitions
- priority will be given to riders who can demonstrate a progression over the previous two years. Riders will be asked to provide three scores that either show a progression through the levels or an increase in the percentages at a single level. Results must be from Competitive competitions with no less than two Judges for each test
- If there are more applicants than places when comparing scores across levels, the scores will weighted by 2% for each level to provide an equal playing field:
 - o Preliminary no weighting,
 - o Novice +2%.
 - o Elementary +4%,
 - o Medium +6%,
 - o Advanced +8% and
 - o FEI +10%.

Foundations for the Future Squads

AOR Future Squad

This Squad comprises a maximum of eight rider/horse combinations and is open to ESA Adult AOR riders. The first two placegetters in the previous year's HOTY (Foundation and AOR categories) will get an automatic invitation to join the Squad. The remaining places will be filled using the qualifying criteria.

EA/FEI Open Future Squad (non AOR)

This Squad comprises a maximum of four rider/horse combinations and is open to ESA EA and FEI riders. The first two place getters in the previous year's EA HOTY will get an automatic invitation to join the Squad. The remaining places will be filled using the qualifying criteria.

Pony Future Squad

This Squad comprises a maximum of four rider/pony combinations and is open to ESA youth riders. The first two placegetters in the previous year's Youth HOTY will get an automatic invitation to join the Squad. The remaining places will be filled using the qualifying criteria.

Youth Future Squad

This Squad comprises a maximum of four rider/horse combinations and is open to ESA youth riders. The first two place getters in the previous year's Youth HOTY will get an automatic invitation to join the Squad. The remaining places will be filled using the qualifying criteria.

Important information for riders:

- riders need to be current Competitive members of ESA
- · all owners need to be current members of ESA
- horses need to be registered with the EA and micro-chipped
- horses must have current Competition Licences
- horses must be sound and fit to satisfy competition standards from the beginning of the Squad year
- riders are role models for the sport and must conform to the EA Code of Conduct, Social Media Policy and Welfare of the Horse Policy
- poor sportsmanship and inappropriate behaviour by Squad members will not be tolerated. Combinations can be removed from the Squad at the discretion of the DSA Committee or ESA Board at any time if poor sportsmanship or inappropriate behaviour has been verified. Combinations will be formally notified of the decision and reasons will be outlined. Mentoring will be offered if the situation is appropriate with the aim of re-instatement
- any rider who has disciplinary proceedings against them enforcing a term of suspension will automatically be removed from the Squad for the remainder of the year
- if at any time a horse and/or rider become unavailable to continue as a member of a Squad for any reason, DSA must be advised in writing. These combinations may be placed on "hold", rather than removed from the Squad, if the unavailability is due to injury of horse or rider. This will depend on the circumstances and is at the discretion of DSA
- where a selected horse is unavailable to attend a clinic due to injury, riders may make a request to DSA to substitute another horse: each application will be considered on merit
- riders may be included on the Squad on more than one horse (subject to the combinations meeting the criteria) but may only register one horse for clinics that are run, unless additional places are available and the organisers choose to offer places to riders with a second Squad horse.
- riders will receive a Squad badge.
- the senior riders will particularly be seen as role models to younger riders and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this
- the young riders will be seen as role models to their peers and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this
- riders may be asked to attend DSA events or Judges' Clinics as demonstration rider/horse combinations from time to time
- riders may be invited to attend user pays training clinics and/or workshops conducted by DSA/DJSC and should make every effort to attend
- there will be no formal review scheduled. However should positions become available, combinations on the reserve list may be notified
 - applications will be open on Nominate with the Squads announced once the selectors have reviewed the applications. Ratified decisions are final
- DSA reserves the right to review and amend the selection criteria and Squad numbers, as and when, required.

Equestrian South Australia Dressage Awards 2022



The Equestrian South Australia (ESA), Dressage South Australia Committee (DSA) makes an Award each year to the most successful horse/pony and rider combinations.

The Awards are announced and presented at the ESA Annual Awards night held at the end of January or early February each year. The winning combinations are awarded an embroidered rug.

The Awards are an aggregate of the nominated competitions held at S A dressage competitions over the course of the year, as well as the Australian Dressage Championships, Australian National Young Rider Championships and the AOR National Championships held interstate. Please refer to the DSA Competition Calendar on the ESA Website which lists the nominated events. https://www.sa.equestrian.org.au/dressage-sa.

The Annual Awards are open to all ESA competitive members and registered horses that hold a current dressage licence. The winner of each division will have the highest aggregate score from the nominated competitions held during the year. Results are taken from the competitive results on the ESA database.

Riders are required to nominate for the 2022 Annual Awards via Nominate, entries will open in mid-December 2021 and be advertised on the DSA Facebook page, there will be a rolling intake however **points will not be back dated if a rider enters after competing at a nominated event.**

HOTY Entry Types

There will be two types of entries:

- 1. Standard HOTY entry is free (Riders must enter via Nominate) Entry:
 - will put the combination into the running for the Annual HOTY Awards that are presented at the ESA Awards night
- 2. Gold HOTY has a \$22 GST inc. administration fee. **Entry:**
 - will put the combination into the running for the Annual HOTY Awards that are presented at the ESA Awards night
 - give riders with multiple horses free Gold HOTY entry for any additional horses.
 - will provide early ticket sales on DSA run events
 - will provide discounted entry to DSA run events
 - will provide the opportunity to participate in HOTY training events on/off horse
 - will provide communications from DSA about upcoming events/opportunities
 - will provide riders a discount on entry to the State Dressage Championships
 - will provide a review for possible automatic invitation to be selected for the Foundations for the Future Squad

One rider may enter the same Award on multiple horses or may enter different horses for different Awards but cannot nominate the same horse for multiple Awards.

Award Categories

FEI Dressage Horse & Rider of the Year aggregate of FEI results from the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over

EA Dressage Horse & Rider of the Year aggregate of results Preliminary - Advanced from the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over

Adult Amateur Owner Rider & Horse of the Year aggregate of AOR results Elementary - Advanced from the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over

Foundation Horse & Rider of the Year aggregate of AOR results Preliminary - Novice from the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over

Dressage Young Rider of the Year aggregate of results from all levels at the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over

Dressage Pony of the Year aggregate of results from all levels at the nominated competitions where scores are 60% or over



Equestrian South Australia Dressage Awards 2022



Criteria for the Awards

- riders must be current ESA members
- horses/ponies must be EA (SA registered) and have a current Dressage Competition Licence
- points are awarded individually to each horse/pony and rider combination placing in official tests at the nominated events
- riders with more than one horse/pony will accrue separate points for each horse/rider combination in their nominated Award category
- points are only awarded if 60% or over is obtained
- points are only awarded for two tests per day
- Participant, Closed Restricted, Closed Unrestricted and Freestyle tests do not count
- pony dressage classes count for points
- youth rider age is from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns **10** years or horses and **8** years for ponies to the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns **21**. This is a combined group, based on current EA Rules for Juniors and Young Riders
- in order to qualify as an Amateur Owner Rider (AOR), riders must declare that they meet the criteria as set out in the National Dressage Rules 4.6.1. It is the AOR's responsibility to ensure they have made it clear on their entries that they are entering as an AOR and to ensure that the draw clearly states they are competing as an AOR this cannot be back dated. If the rider is not listed on the draw as an AOR combination, they cannot accrue points for that specific competition. The onus is on the rider to make it clear prior to the competition.


New Life Memberships


