May 12, 2019 Fourth Sunday of Easter Jn 10:27-30

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Mother's Day! We give thanks to God for our mothers today! They with our fathers gave us life and faith! We thank them for the sacrifices they made for us children growing up, including all the wipes of our dirty faces, the helps-up after falls, the miraculous kisses that healed scraped knees, the favorite foods they alone know how to make, the faithful trips to church and the daily prayers they taught us at morning, meals and bedtimes! We thank you, MOMS! May God bless you for your love!

And like a good mother, Jesus keeps the gospel short today on such a full day of so many celebrations: Third Sunday Easter, Mother's Day, Mary Crownings, First Communions! For Louisvillians, it is also still Clean-Up Days from last weekend's DERBY! So Jesus in the gospel today, offers a simple reflection upon what it means to love others and tend to their needs. He calls it 'shepherding' them! Of course, Jesus alone is the Model Caregiver, as he says, "I am the good shepherd" (John 10:11). In the same verse, he points out what makes a Good Shepherd: He or she 'lays down his (her) life for the sheep'. Sounds like a good mom, too! Jesus highlights His own shepherding style, because He sets Himself as the standard for any Christian leader. After Jesus' resurrection, He takes the one-on-one time with Peter, to forgive and help Peter forgive himself, after Peter's public denials of Jesus before the crucifixion. We heard in last week's gospel how Jesus gives a lift to Peter and re-instates him back on to the Way of 'Disciple-Leadership'. Jesus invited Peter to recommit himself to following Him, asking Peter three times, to restate his love of Him. As Peter declared his love, Jesus re-directs Peter to show that love by caring for the sheep of Jesus' flock. In John chapter 21, Jesus tells Peter in verse 15, "Feed my lambs", in verse 16, "Tend my sheep" and finally again in verse 17 to "Feed my sheep." Knowing that Peter is eventually martyred for Jesus, Peter did get the message this time. I think this episode reveals again what a personal Shepherd we have in Jesus. Even with all the commotion after the resurrection, Jesus steps aside to take a moment, and hold this close encounter of reconciliation and recommitment for Peter, the designated leader of Jesus' flock. As always, with Jesus, little things mean a lot. So even our short four verses of gospel today, tell us of the infinite Love of the Good Shepherd for us, His sheep.

We hear one of the most comforting lines of the gospel, today. I know there are so many, but Jesus tells us today that He holds and protects us dearly (okay, sheeply!). Jesus has us! Like many people's shirts or wristbands say today, "God has this"! Well, God does have us! In John 10:28 Jesus says, "No one can take them out of my hand" referring to His sheep. He repeats it a verse later (29) adding the 'Father's hand'. Of course, with the Holy Trinity, what one person has, they all have, Father, Son and Holy Ghost! So God has ALL THIS covered! I know I say this a lot and reflect on it in a lot of my public comments, such as at funerals and at any time of loss, that if we can get and remain in God's hands, then all is well! I invite us all to reminisce about how as little children we all had the experience of running to our parents' arms to be picked up and held secure after some fear or injury. We may have thought, "Whatever it takes, if we can only get back into those arms, then everything is going to be okay!" Well, Jesus knows that His shepherd arms and hands are the security and comfort we long for in our times of need. And He comes through saying, 'No one can take my own from my hands'! Like an echo from some movie line (300), Jesus says He hold us in his hands even through death! His faithful hold on us, overwhelms me with thankfulness. Similarly, St Paul offers the same comforting thought in Romans 8:38-39 when he says that nothing can separate us from the Love of Christ. "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord". What a marvel of love to know that Christ embraced our humanity, undergoing the full depths of human experience and suffering (death) to identify in all possible ways with us and stay forever by our side, in life and death. Jesus says it all in John 16:33 "I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have overcome the world."
