Message from the Pastor

Psalm 126 says, "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with shouts of joy! Then they said among the nations, 'the Lord has done great things for them.' The Lord has done great things for us; we are glad." The Psalmist was talking about the Israelites return from captivity – they had been exiled in Babylon for 70 years. When they were finally able to return to their beloved Holy City, Jerusalem, they were like men who dream. They couldn't comprehend it – it was too good to be true!

We had our first service here in Piedmont on Sunday May 1st! What a blessing! But what a blessing all of you people are! So many have worked so hard to get this place in order!

Oh, the joy! The joy of the blessing of our God! Yes, we are filled with laughter! We don't quite get it! We shout for joy! If we ever doubt we have a miracle working God, all we have to do is remember how God worked in our behalf! We were like the Israelites in Egypt. They had no way to free themselves. They had no money to buy their freedom; they had no weapons to fight their way out. They were slaves; they had taskmasters supervising them constantly. God sent plagues on the Egyptians! Pharaoh's heart was softened long enough for them to get out of town! Similarly, we had no way to free ourselves. We had no way to purchase this church. God moved and we are glad!
