#### To Stop or Not to Stop

I was driving down the road yesterday with my daughter, Emily when we came to a stopped school bus on the opposite side of the street. There were a few cars in front of me that passed the bus as it was dropping off kids after school. As I saw this all quickly unfolding, I said out loud, "Do I stop?" Is the turn lane considered a median? But the cars in front of me didn't stop...so I think I don't have to stop?" Emily, being a rather new driver, began to question herself after somewhat confidently telling me I should stop. Although I slowed down, I didn't stop, because I wasn't sure what the rules were, and I saw the others go by without a pause. Afterwards, I immediately said, "I should've stopped. Better to be safe than sorry." Later that day, I asked Charlie who drives for a living, about my encounter and he confirmed what I thought, which is that YES, I should've stopped because the turn lane isn't a barrier. I should have known that but honestly, I don't pass stopped school busses very often, and it has been A LONG time since I have had to read the Driver's Handbook.

These teachings are not empty words; they are your very life

DEUTERONOMY 32:46-47

You know, it made me think about the phrase, "Ignorance is no excuse for breaking the law." After all, it is the responsibility of the driver to KNOW the law. If a cop had pulled me over yesterday for passing that school bus, he may have let me off the hook because of my genuine "ignorance", but he would have been perfectly within his power to write me a ticket because I disobeyed the law.

God's law is similar to the Driver's Handbook - it has the rules in it to keep us safe, and help all of us get along on the road we call "life". When we follow the Handbook, we have purpose and direction. It doesn't always keep us from the bumps, wrecks and delays in life, but we have the assurance that we are going to reap the blessings that come with obedience. In my example above, my knowledge was limited, and although unintentional, disobedience was the result. Furthermore, in this situation, everything happened so fast, I didn't have

a chance to consult the Driver's Handbook to get the information needed to make the right choice. That's the same with God's Word. We shouldn't wait until a situation or crisis arises to consult God's Word for direction or counsel. However, if we become a student of God's Word, and develop a regular, daily Biblical intake, our lives will show it. We will be able to proceed confidently through the things that come our way, knowing what we should or shouldn't do. Don't you wish everyone on the road obeyed the Driver's Handbook? In the same way, don't you wish all your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ obeyed the Word of God? How much more unity we would have!

In summary, if you know the Word, you will be ready for whatever comes your way. Don't wait until an emergency arises before seeing the importance of the Word of God. Knowing God's Word is life to us!

"Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law. 47 They are not just idle words for you—they are your life. ## Joy Unspeakable

to school and church programs and we spread the much-talked-about holiday joy. But what is joy? Merriam-Webster defines joy as "the emotion evoked by well-being, success, or good fortune or by the prospect of possessing what one desires: DELIGHT". But joy to the Christian should be this and so much more: One of Baker's Evangelical Dictionary definitions of joy on the spiritual level is "The extreme happiness with which the believer contemplates salvation and the bliss of the afterlife.



Joy characterizes the corporate worship life in which the individual participates, Psalm 122 reads "I rejoiced with those who said to me, 'Let us go the house of the Lord" There is truly joy when we gather as a body. In the times of corporate worship we join with others of like faith to worship God, sing praises to his name, reflect on his goodness and be cleansed through God's word. As believers we rejoice because God has surrounded us with his steadfast love and brought us to salvation. Joy is that response to God's word and God's reward to believers and builds their faith. In Galatians 5:22 the Apostle Paul speaks of joy as one of the fruits of the spirit and in Romans 14:17 as "joy in the Holy Spirit" as a part of the kingdom of God. In the New Testament Paul associated joy with faith, hope, brotherly fellowship and sympathy.

Christian joy is not just a mountain top experience that knows no trouble, but is the result of our faith over adverse and trying circumstances, which, instead of stopping our joy, actually make us rejoice more. Jesus exemplified this in Hebrews where He said, "for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame." There is joy in our suffering when we look to God in our pain.

I feel our joy can be summed up in 1 Peter 1:(6-8) 6Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations: 7That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ: 8Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory: 9Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls. Let us Look to Jesus the "author and finisher of our faith" as our joy, our faith and our salvation are connect in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. ## **God Brings All Things Together**

A few years ago, Faye and I had the privilege of teaching, preaching and fellowshipping with some Christian believers in Mongolia. One of the places we visited was the Yarmag Church of God in Ulaanbaatar, the capital city. This church was in an area where extreme poverty exists. There is virtually nothing for the children or youth to do, and many follow in the footsteps of their parents toward a lifestyle of alcohol and drug abuse, along with much domestic violence. Unknown to us at that time was a young man and woman whom I would later meet when I taught a course at the Asian School of Christian Ministries in Manila, Philippines. This young man and woman had married and were attending the seminary, preparing for ministry. When they finished their degrees they returned to Mongolia and later became the pastors of the Yarmag Church. Then, in 2016, the couple traveled with Tom and Jennifer Wolverton, our missionaries in Mongolia, to the U.S., during which time they visited KCOG. You may remember the couple dressed in their native dress when they spoke at one of our services. Taivanaa Bat-Erdene (American name "Peter") and his wife, Tsolmon Enk-Amgalaan ("Rebekah") never asked for any assistance, however, KCOG graciously agreed to help their church by raising a spontaneous offering of \$10,000 toward helping build a community center on the church property. Since that time, the Yarmaq church has completed the construction and has opened the doors to the community. I recently received a letter from "Rebekah" sharing some of what has been happening. This is the gist of the letter:

Hello dear Brother John and dear Kannapolis Church of God.

We have very great news to share. Our children and youth development center is opened. We opened May 30. With the help of your support we finally achieved what we wanted to do.... Many children are coming to study, to learn English, to have healthy safe fellowship with one another. For some of the kids who comes here regularly said it's much (more) comfortable than their home's both spiritually and physically. 3 weeks ago 2 of the girls who come here to study regularly got saved and attending church. It's such a pleasure to share goodness of God young people who are looking for Hope and Peace.

(Our church has had an exciting year). We started implementing systematic bible study and all our church member began to join in April. Since then church atmosphere just changed. We asked maybe forced and encouraged our church cell group leaders to have personal relationship with Jesus everyday through Quite time and Prayer. It may sound bit rude to you but we asked full commitment and those who missed quite time (we check them every week they have their own journal) and daily prayer we made them clean church bathrooms which is outhouse, and wash the church floor and walls. First 3 months people were washing wall and floors but now they love doing prayer and quite times. God's word is so powerful and once they began to understand it's actually good for them to have regular devotion, quite time they started loving it. It's God himself and our constant pushing helped.

Once our church leaders started doing it they are becoming more joyful and so much willingness to share Gospel. Since April till December 12 in church we had 64 new people came to church and 25 of them accepted Jesus as their Savoir. Me and our church leaders are seeing the labor of fruit and it gives us so much joy of serving and sharing good news. God is so good to us.

As much as we are pouring our life and love to this place same time some things are wants to bring us down. Spiritual war is real here some of the new comers wouldn't attend church because their family members are shamans and they are afraid they might be cursed. Or other fears lead them away from salvation but we are continually praying for them and believing that once seed is planted God will not let them just wonder.

God bless you sir.

We are grateful and praying for you all.

KCOG has been providing some support during 2017 (\$200 monthly) to the church and Center, and recently the deacons agreed to a request from our Missions Committee to increase that amount to \$300 monthly for 2018. We would be happy to forward any individual donations also should you feel led to give.

It is amazing how God has brought us all together in this process. May He get all the glory for the Kingdom work that is being done in His Name in Mongolia and in Kannapolis! Pray for our brothers and sisters in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia!
