Boost Your Competition Confidence - Part 2

The last article looked at the reason behind nerves and how our focus and language influence our feelings about a situation. Once we understand what is going on inside our heads, we can add in some easy strategies to change our mind from fear and nerves to absolute performance confidence, in any situation!

In this article I will share some NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming) techniques to help boost your confidence.

(1) Visualisation

One of the most effective ways of building confidence is to visualise the event running successfully. Our brain doesn't know the difference between real or fake and whatever you imagine will feel real to your brain. When it feels real to your brain, it will feel real to your body. This is where fear can expand. If you fear and imagine the worst happening, your body will respond! Have you ever had a time where you imagined eating your favourite food and your mouth has started salivating? This is how strong our mind body connection is. Amazing!

Some tips to help visualise the successful points of your competition or ride:

Imagine your test going right

Every time you think about your test, create a picture that sees every moment going right. Keep control of your thoughts and keep on track of what you want to happen. Sometimes those thoughts of 'what if' can sneak in...don't let them. Scratch them out and push those positive thoughts back in.

First, imagine looking through your own eyes

Imagine riding the test looking through your own eyes (associated) in that you see what you will see when you ride. So, include seeing your horse's ears as if you are riding, imagine riding down the centreline and seeing the Judge at the other end.

It's really key that the visualisation is vivid and includes each movement of the test – this will help with memorising the test as well! Include what you will see, what you will hear and what you will feel.

Second, watch yourself in a movie

The second part of visualising is to take the image you've created of yourself and project it out onto a screen, as if you are watching yourself in a movie (disassociated). By doing this, you'll be in no doubt that it's you riding this fantastic dressage test!

Ramp it up

In both these visualisations we now want to increase everything. Make the images brighter, closer, bigger. Make the sounds louder, closer. Make the feelings as strong as they can be how do you want to feel when you are riding? What emotions do you want to be present?

(2) Anchoring

Have you ever smelt a perfume and been instantly reminded of a loved one? It's their signature perfume! That is an anchor. When something like a smell, a sound, a place, or a touch is associated with something else. Including anchoring before a test is an amazing way to bring instant confidence.

All it requires to set a song as an anchor is to pick a song that inspires and motivates you, one that really builds you up. Using headphones, play the song as you visualise your test going amazingly. Do this process once a day leading up to the day of your competition. Add it to your warm-up routine on the day and voila! You're in an amazing state to ride into your test with.

(3) Anxiety Model

A super tip for any time you're feeling anxious is to check in with what you were thinking about just before those feelings. A big part of NLP is owning the control of your feelings, your thoughts and your actions. There's no place for blaming the outside world.

Boost Your Competition Confidence - Part 2 (Cont'd)

Anxiety then, is a warning from your mind that you're focusing on the wrong things — that is usually the event going badly!

We can swap this easily to focusing on the event going amazingly! In particular for this model, imagining 15 minutes after the successful completion of the test. What will you feel, see, and hear after the test has finished? Be careful here that it's only the SUCCESSFUL completion of the event! So firstly, it is important to know what success means for you.

(4) Power Poses

Such a simple addition to a warm-up are Power Poses. Standing like Wonder Woman or Superman – hands on hips, chin up, taking deep breaths for 15 minutes will increase your confidence no end!

A version of this can be replicated in the saddle. Riding with a confident posture — head up, focused ahead of you, shoulders back and strong, taking deep breaths. Adding a smile will fire happy signals to your brain and trick yourself into thinking it feels good.

By putting these four strategies together, you can trick your mind into believing it has unbelievable confidence. When you ride in this state, you ride so differently than when nerves are taking over. Your horse will feel the difference and you will feel on top of the world. Remind yourself to focus on what you want to happen and remember, we are all in this sport because we love it, right? Let's not take it all too seriously and have fun!

If these strategies aren't hitting the spot, perhaps there are deeper limiting beliefs lurking for you. Finding the root cause of those beliefs and clearing them up helps give you the confidence you deserve! One-on-one coaching digs into these beliefs and leaves you feeling lighter and free from any emotional baggage you've been dragging around. Coming Back To The State Champs After A Long Break: by Elizabeth Haggett

After returning to the SA State Dressage Championships after a six year break, it was the first time in a very long time I had actually been nervous. Having competed in dressage for the last 31 years, this had been the longest break away from a big event. Due to injured horses, then only having either retired or unbroken horses, plus having my two children in between, the years flew by and then it was all action for 2022. A young mare we purchased as a yearling I have been quietly working away with, when I am able to ride and building up to the Championships wasn't easy. Even the week leading into them, I wasn't sure if I would get there. These Championships though, from the time away I put a lot of pressure on myself, but knew I had a lovely horse to ride and thought if we can just do what we do and do it well, then the results will be what they will be. That was the difference in my way of thinking this competition. Regardless of the success, I was very pleased with young 'Finesse'. Having returned from a six year State Championships break, it didn't feel like a regular competition. It felt extra exciting, extra big, extra special and something I'd set my mind to a good 12 months earlier. The grounds were beautiful to ride on, the prizes and entries for the various sections has certainly increased and it was a very well run event. Congratulations and many thanks to the organisers, sponsors, volunteers and fellow competitors.

A Stallion Owner's Perspective: by Karen Horsell

The culmination of a year filled with hours of training finishes with the chance to exhibit our achievements at the 2022 State Dressage Championships. Justification for all the work and something measurable to validate our passion. Tension and nerves bring a crispness to the morning vibe - more often than not is matched by the weather - as we work through our routine in the warm up arena ahead of what we hope are our best moves in front of the Judges and our peers. Spruced-up fourlegged partners, manes knotted into balls, no longer flaunting the manure stains and paddock remnants from the day before. Some of us with white horses may still be trying to erase colour fluctuations as we mount for the warm up! Halt, track right at C ... track right ... right ... right is the repetitive loop in my head as we try to distinguish which test route we are about to navigate. As a stallion owner, it's not only the test arena we need to navigate carefully. Always vigilant of awkward situations and warily glancing at tails of passing mares. Never really able to sneak through the floats to the warm up arena without the four-legged bundle of hormones announcing himself with vigour. The added spring in his stride is always welcome, however, a snort backed up with the twist of the neck, is treated as potential risk management.

Riding a stallion at a competition is a privilege, built on trust and mutual respect. Enabling him to express himself and re-directing the energy and flirtatious advances is a fluid balancing act. This vigilance continues beyond the end of the test, all the way back to the float, including the undressing and rub down. Socialising with other competitors is limited as a stallion requires constant supervision unless he is returned to the sanctuary of the float! The safety of his stall on wheels allows him to finally relax, chill out, eat hay and no longer be on guard for the imminent adventure of an advancing mare or a challenging stance from a gelding! Often the 'stallion' gets a bad rap in terms of behaviour. To take a stallion to a competition they must have an exceptional temperament, be well handled conditioned to accept the competition atmosphere.





The green tags and discs are not for decoration, they are mandated to improve the visibility in order to help protect the well-being of those around them and the stallion himself from unnecessary encounters. It's a sign that there is a well-trained and disciplined horse resisting the temptations of nature. Please be mindful of your approach and distance as we stallion handlers and riders are forever conscious of the safety and respect of our fellow competitors. Thank you to Dressage SA, the Committee members, Judges, volunteers and Veronica Hannam for organising such a well-run State Dressage Competition. I look forward to the 2023 event and many more.

Practical Exam: by Tracy Tillman

The SA State Dressage Championships were looming, the last piece of the puzzle for my judging upgrade with my

impending practical exam. Despite having co-judged, shadow judged, pencilled and with sat-in numerous senior level the Judges, nerves and self -doubt were definitely manifesting.

Making the whole process a little more bearable was firstly having confidence in the mentoring and Judge education I had received, and secondly having confidence in the knowledge that this event would be very well managed. Dressage competitions take a lot of organisation and effort at the best of times but adding the facilitation of exams, sits-ins and shadow judging to the list of never-ending tasks, is next level. Knowing that what I needed to complete my practical exam would be facilitated by the organising Committee certainly gave me one less thing to worry about. My Judge Examiner provided some advice and words of wisdom as we readied for the competition ahead. A few hours later I was able to breath a sigh of relief, the exam was over and the reality was the whole process had actually been an informative and rewarding experience.

Logistics of competing from Pony / Youth Perspective: by Keeley Menadue

At the State Dressage Championships I competed on my pony Ibnky Xquisit, also known as Donny. Unfortunately leading up to the competition, my other pony FL Rocksette, or Rosie, experienced a paddock injury and therefore was not able to attend. This however allowed me to concentrate on Donny for the weekend.

I love competing at this event every year, because as a rider it allows you to compare your riding to some of the best competitors in the State, at one of the largest South Australian dressage events of the year.



The atmosphere at the State Championships is also something that I look forward to, and is more comparable to that of Interstate and National competitions, providing a good opportunity to expose horses and get more experience at bigger events. I also always look forward to receiving feedback from high level and Interstate Judges, providing a different perspective on our training and giving me more to work on.

Particularly as a Pony rider, I love that I can compare my training not only to the horses, but that there are more Ponies competing at this event than at any throughout the year. However, I would still love to see more Pony riders out competing to increase the level of competition, especially in the higher levels. According to the Australian Sports Pony Registry, to compete in official Pony Dressage, a Pony must be registered with Equestrian Australia and not exceed 148cm (14.21/4 hh) without shoes. Pony Dressage encompasses levels from Preliminary to Grand Prix and is becoming more popular recently in Australia after a European influence. With more people and more interest, it is hopeful that the level of competition and quality will continue to grow, and I am excited to see where this will leave us in the future!

As a Youth rider, I love that the State Championships also provides an opportunity to see other Youth riders in a familiar environment. I appreciate that we can watch each other ride, as well as watch higher level tests be performed, and encourage and support one another with some friendly competition.

Thank you to the Mount Crawford Dressage Club and Dressage SA for hosting and running the event. Thank you also to the Judges, stewards, gear checkers, organisers, sponsors and everyone involved in making this possible. Congratulations to all the competitors.

Riding for Owners: by Steph Hann

Preparing for a Championship competition when I'm riding horses for an owner is not that different to when I compete my own horses. Some of the differences really occur prior to the competition when I sit down with the owner and discuss lead up preparations, plans and goals.

Physio, farriery, dentistry and fitness regimes are all planned around major competitions like this one to ensure that the horses are able to perform as well as they can.

It is very important to the partnership that the owner is on board with how the horse is working and prepared along with any issues that may come up that would reduce the ability of the horse to perform at its best. I consider any physical issues that may need to be addressed at the last minute by our physio.

Extra things that I do when I have an owner's horses competing also relate to making sure that the owner knows exactly when I'll be arriving at a competition ground, when the warmup will start and other minor details that I hope will enhance their enjoyment of the event

I also enjoy the after-competition review where we look at results and chat about the next step in each horse's future plan. It is at this point that we look at what we did, what went wrong and what we can do to improve for next time.



An AOR Rider: by Jen Benson

DSA has kindly asked for my experience at the 2022 SA Dressage Championship as an AOR and I am very excited to share my thoughts. I love to ride dressage for so many reasons but I equally love to compete in our sport for a couple of simple reasons - dressage is one of the very few true mixed sex sports and where age is no barrier. So technically I can go to the Olympics sooner or later, it's kinda up to me. Except for one factor, and that is how long it takes to become an expert.



Research shows that it takes 10,000 hrs of deliberate practice to become an expert, so with the hours I can dedicate to riding, some weeks it looks like it will be 50 years for me to get close to 10,000h in the saddle. In contrast our professional riders can achieve "expert" proficiency in 6-10yrs based on the number of horses in work and days riding per year. In my mind, this is the only limitation in our sport. Until now. The AOR division has been created to provide high level dressage competition for Australian Amateur Owner Riders. The intent is that we can compete against riders for whom riding is not our primary source of income and most importantly are the primary trainer of the horse, only receiving occasional ridden assistance in a lesson scenario. My lead up to the 2022 SA State Championship was the usual crazy juggling of interstate work and nonhorse commitments whilst trying to stick to my training plan. It was definitely a competition where "sometime you win and sometimes you learn" and this time around my results were a direct reflection of the quality of my training (good bits) and just how busy 2022 has been (the learning bits). I am truly grateful to the OC, sponsors and volunteers who enable this division at our State championship as it allows us to showcase our beautiful horses and measure our training in the level playing field that is the dressage arena.



Best Seat in the House: by Shelley Arnold

Once again, I had the honour of being on the PA at the Dressage Championships held at Mt Crawford Dressage Club and I (arguably, one could say) had the best seat in the house. Having a great view of 4 arenas being used continuously for 2 days is literally a Feast of Dressage in this State, so I was certainly sitting in a 'Premium Seat' at this venue.

Was it a demanding job? Well, yes. Was it fun? Most of the time. Was it rewarding? Absolutely!!

There have been some great progressions up the levels during this time.

The office at Mt Crawford is the hub of any competition and it was fantastic to witness the friendly atmosphere generated by everyone who attended and the great camaraderie during the presentations. It is a very difficult task to correctly train a Dressage horse and genuine recognition and support for those who have success makes a big event, such as this, so much more enjoyable for everyone.

Congratulations to Mt Crawford Dressage Club for putting on a superbly run event with outstanding attention to detail, a wonderful group of Sponsors and vast array of prizes. It's been a bit of a nerve-wracking time booking events recently due to the COVID-19 situation. There is only one of me, so to prevent the possibility of ending up in isolation for the event, I do my best to avoid social settings for the week or so before (my inner introvert has no complaints about this!). I live just over an hour away from the dressage grounds, so my alarm goes off very early in the morning so I can get to the grounds before the event starts.



President's Report


