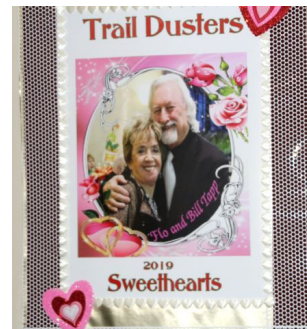


wonderful as they paraded around the dance hall to the thunderous applause of our enthusiastic and supportive Trail Dusters.

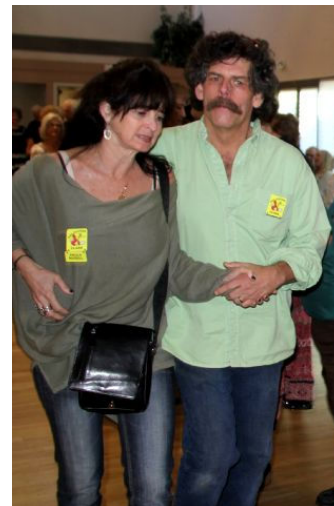


## \*\*\*\*\* **A Square D** JANUARY'S STUDENT STOMP
