Hats, hats and more hats in every style and hue. Did you know that in 1865, John Batterson Stetson invented and sold his first hat in Central City, Colorado, a wide-brimmed, high-crowned, design that he called Boss of the Plains, more commonly known as the "ten-gallon cowboy hat".

John Stetson was a hatmaker from New Jersey who moved west to seek his fortune during the gold rush. Stetson's cowboy hat was later renamed "Stetson" after the maker and other styles later followed. We have Fedora, Derby, Fascinator, stovepipes, and baseball caps, lamp shades, fancy and decorated with all types's equins, flowers, ribbons, brooches, feathers and tulle even tied, knotted and twisted.







In styling the men wore hard felt hats that match the suits that they were wearing and the ladies had to have a matching decorated hat just to match their outfit they were wearing. In "72nd Annual Lay Convention, The 11th EEDLO Benevolent Auxiliary held a "Hattitude Fashion Show Extravaganza" of men and women showing off the hats that best suited them, as they strolled across the floor and model there style of HAT with gloves and mint julep for the Derby, Church and other occasions. Hats were posed from tilting on the side and pulled forwarded. We were brought to tears and laughter with comedians of Christian Comedy by Darius Kerrison.

If you are not a hat person just try one for the fun and let light shine on your head, tilt it pull over the eye to the side and pull straight on the head. There is a "HAT" just for you for church, wedding, gardening, riding and just for show. "Hattitude says that I take my hat, tip, bring it back or bring it down, but when I walk out I decide who I am by the hat I put on my head."
