A friend of mine used to make these for our office and they were great. **Mickie's Blackbottom Cups**

Cake Batter:

1 1/2 cups sifted flour

1 cups of sugar

1/4 cup of cocoa powder

1/3 cup of vegetable oil

½ cup of water

½ teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon white vinegar



Filling:

1 (8oz) brick of cream cheese

1 egg

1/3 cup of sugar

1/8 teaspoon salt

6 ounces of chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray mini muffin tin with non-stick spray.

Mix all ingredients for cake batter. Spoon evenly into muffin tin.

Mix all ingredients for filling except chocolate chips. Fold chips into filling mixture. Spoon on top of cake batter mixture. Bake for 15 minutes. Cool for 15 minutes. Turn out of muffin tin.

"I don't think so," he replied. "It takes her awhile to change her clothes, so she's probably still upstairs in the bathroom taking off of her hospital gown and getting dressed."


