### “NEXT-LEVEL” THINKING

I had a LOT of time to think, read, dream and pray during the 6 weeks I was out recovering from surgery. At first, I thought about...well...recovering! But as the days turned into weeks and the recovery was going so well, I began to think more and more about our church. This is an outstanding congregation! Period. End of sentence! I don't think you all realize just how special The Aledo United Methodist Church is. Pound for pound, you are doing more ministry and outreach than most of the 700+ United Methodist churches in our Illinois Great Rivers Conference! How awesome is that?

In the 16<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of Luke, Jesus says, "If you are faithful in little things, you will be faithful in large ones." Think about that for a moment. There is a fairly strong implication inherent in that statement. Jesus is saying that, if you do well with the little things He entrusted to you, He will entrust you with bigger things. It makes sense. That's how Joanne and I raised our boys. As they matured, we "tested" them with little things. And once they proved they could succeed at those little things, we expanded their horizons and began trusting them with bigger things.

It is clear that God has consistently trusted our congregation with bigger and bigger things. All you have to do is look at the last several years to see how powerfully He is working in and through this congregation. And it seems just as clear that He is pleased with what we have done. And that is EXACTLY what we want to be- pleasing to God.

But that also means that God is ready to trust us with even more. Over the next few months, we will be challenged to step even further "out of the box" and deeper into God's will. What exactly does that look like? Only God knows! But He has laid on my heart that He wants us to expand- the best way to reach new people is to offer new ministries.

The Sunday evening worship service is being re-tooled and will roll out a new format, in an effort to offer another "full" worship opportunity to folks in the community who can't attend Sunday mornings. More studies and other learning opportunities will be offering beginning in the fall. Continuing study is essential to strengthening and deepening your faith. Youth and Children's ministries are changing and expanding this fall. More people will be invited to step out in faith and take greater responsibility for more ministries. (A paid staff consisting of a few people can only do SO much. But a church FULL of ministers can change the world!)

I invite you to do two things over the rest of this summer:

1. pray about what God is calling us to and
2. buckle up and hang on- it's going to be a GREAT ride!

## CURRENT SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, June 22, we began a new sermon series- Rev. Mark's FIRST since returning! The series is called The Psizzlin' Psummer Psalm Psermon Pseries. Psalms are religious poems or songs, designed to be set to music. Some are hymns to be sung by a congregation. Some are private prayers. Some are lyrical devices for remembering major events in Israel's history. The Book contains 150 psalms, making it the longest book in the Bible, based on number of chapters. Every human emotion, every circumstance of daily life are captured in these 150 chapters.

This 11-week series will carry us through the rest of the summer...AND through the trials and tribulations, the highs and lows of life. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

- **Sunday, July 20, 2014- The Judgment Seat** (Psalm 75)  
We are called to love, not judge. (Genesis 3:8-10, Romans 2:1-4)
- **Sunday, July 27, 2014- Here is Our King** (Psalm 93)  
Who's at the top of YOUR list? (Luke 1:31-33, 1Timothy 6:12-16)
- **Sunday, August 3, 2014- Thank You!** (Psalm 100)  
Shout for joy- the Lord is good! (1Chronicles 16:31-35, Hebrews 12:28)
- **Sunday, August 10, 2014- Surely the Presence** (Psalm 121)  
God is our source of help. (Jeremiah 31:10-12, Philippians 4:4-7)
- **Sunday, August 17, 2014- Faith Like a Child** (Psalm 131)  
We are called to be child-like, but not childish. (Hosea 11:1-4, Romans 8:12-17)
- **Sunday, August 24, 2014- The Cave** (Psalm 142)  
A Place to hide...or a hiding place? (Isaiah 2:19-21, 2Corinthians 4:1-3)
- **Sunday, August 31, 2014- Better Than a Hallelujah!** (Psalm 150)  
Praise God in every situation. (Isaiah 43:16-21, 1Peter 2:9-10)

This includes anyone who has lost their spouse, divorced or separated, or whose loved one is in the nursing home. The Caring Hearts ministry here at AUMC provides a CIA luncheon once each month. This month, the luncheon will be on **Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup>, immediately following the 10:15AM worship service.** You don't have to bring anything except yourself. Feel free to invite a friend to share the meal and fellowship. I will look forward to seeing you on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July at 11:30AM!



### AUMC SAFETY TEAM

AUMC now has a new Safety Team with the following members: Jenn Anderson, Ruth Dulaney, Melissa Hajostek, Rev. Mark Harris, Jean Schroeder, Debbie Swank, and Neil Truman. The team has been developed from a need that was seen by the Caring Hearts Program. The team will work together to help make Aledo United Methodist Church a safer environment to worship.

Over the next few months, the following safety issues will be addressed:

- Health Safety
- Food Safety
- Safety Awareness
- Community Preparedness
- Fire Safety
- Environmental Safety
- Safety Education

### The first focus is your Health Safety.

1. Through your generosity, the AED (Automated External Defibrillator) has been purchased. It is hanging on the wall in the Fellowship Room between the door and the wall TV monitor. The AED can restore a regular heart rhythm during a sudden cardiac arrest.
2. Seven church members have taken the first CPR/AED class given April 28<sup>th</sup>. Another CPR/AED class will be offered early in the fall. If you would like to attend this free class and become CPR certified, please sign up in the church office.
3. We are blessed with many health professionals in our congregation. In order to know who is a trained individual or has medical training, a list is being compiled in the church office. We are asking that medical professionals and those with CPR certification give your name and a copy of your CPR card to Debbie Swank. We know that many are willing to come to the aid of those are in an emergency health need, but this list will help others know who to ask when needed.
4. Two basic First Aid kits are located in the kitchen and one is also located on the shelf in the education wing. Two expanded first aid kits are being compiled to include more emergency equipment, such as a blood pressure cuff, stethoscope, stretch bandages, Glucose meter, and Glucose gel. One of the larger first aid kits will be located near the AED and the other one in the basement. The supplies for the kits will be maintained by the Safety Team.

We are getting AMBITIOUS at this year's Vacation Bible School! In addition to the "normal" VBS programming, we are adding dinner AND an adult Bible study class in an effort to make it more of a family event. I will be leading the Adult Bible Study and here's what it looks like:

### **Faith: A Four-Day Mini Bible Study**

**WHAT:** Rev. Mark's Adult VBS Class

**WHEN:** Sunday, July 13 through Wednesday, July 16, 5:30PM-7:15PM

**WHERE:** In the Chapel next to the sanctuary

**WHY:** In this four-night mini Bible Study, you will examine your faith and what it means to have faith in God. Our faith begins with what we know and believe about God. Our faith will carry us how far we are willing to let it take us. Faith is a choice and we need to begin by choosing to believe in Jesus and His power to move mountains, heal the sick, and save us from all our sins through His sacrifice on the cross. 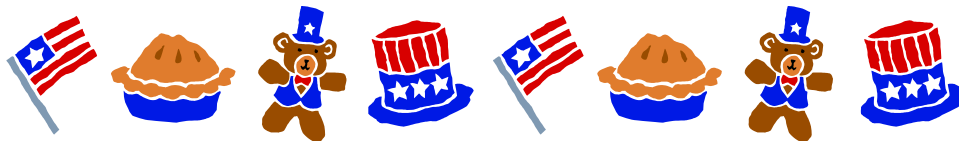

## Independence Day

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee but with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty...from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more." Adams' prediction was off by two days!

In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary. President James Monroe died exactly five years later, on July 4, 1831.

We have much to be grateful for in this country. Celebrate our nation's independence- thank God for our freedom!



## WHAT ARE YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS?

**Are you aware of how many ministries there are in your church? (Here's a hint- a LOT!) ### Description of Teams

**Finance Team**– meet once/month, sets yearly budget, makes decisions about raising/spending money.

**Staff/Parish Relations Team**– meet quarterly, the church's "Human Resources" department, liaison between church/staff, responsible for employment issues.

**Lay Leadership Team**– meet infrequently throughout the year (mostly in the fall) to set ministry teams/team leadership for the coming year.

**Trustees Team**– meet once/month, responsible for the real property of the church– the church building itself and the parsonage.

**Missions Team**– meet quarterly, guides the mission work of the church, both locally and globally through a variety of outlets.

**Outreach Team**– meet every other month, focuses on how to reach the members of our community who do not have a church home.

**Audit Team**– annually audit the church's finances

**Endowment/Memorial Team**– meet every other month to administer both the Endowment and Memorial Funds

**Worship Team**– meet every other month, plans special worship events and discusses current trends within the worship services

**Music Ministry**– do you sing? (Choir) Play an instrument? (Praise Band, Bell Choir, piano/organ, other) Like to organize?

**Usher/Greeter Team**– Provide folks to welcome and greeter people coming to our worship services

**AWANA**– meet weekly through the school year, providing a powerful ministry to the children of Mercer County

**Youth/Children's Team**– help guide our Youth Groups with planning, dreaming and implementation.

**Children's Church**– Operate at either the 8AM and 10:15AM worship services every Sunday, providing age-appropriate worship for our youngest.

**Education Team**– meet quarterly, steers the Christian Education of the church, including Sunday School.

**United Methodist Women**– meet monthly, plans and implements social events, fundraising events and LOTS of ministries.

**United Methodist Men**– meet monthly, plans and implements social events, fundraising events and LOTS of ministries.

**Caring Hearts Team**– meet regularly, carries out an ever-growing list of ministries (food ministry, card ministry, backpack food program, etc.) designed to help meet the basic needs of people in our community and beyond.

**Wednesday Night Fellowship**– help plan/implement this weekly program.

**Funeral Luncheons**– help provide comfort to families when they need it the most

**Publication Team**– fold and sort bulletins/newsletters for distribution

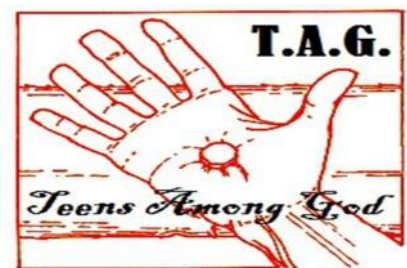
**Hospitality Team**– plan and implements programs designed to make AUMC even more welcoming.

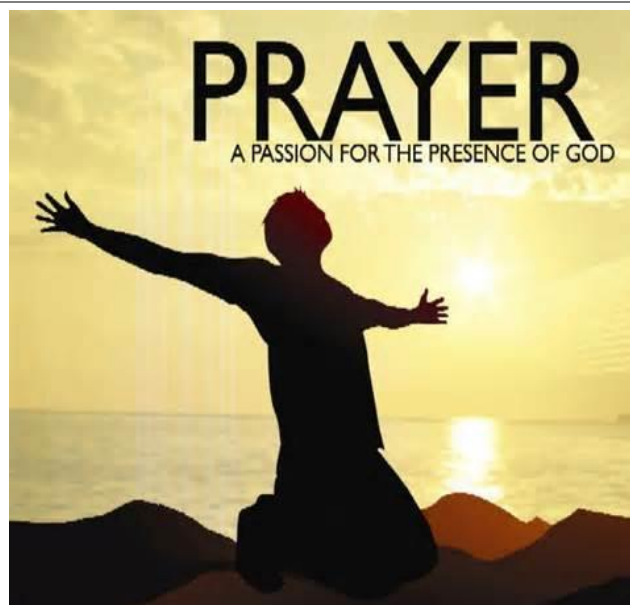
### Hebrews 11:6

And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

The key words in our text today are “earnestly seek Him.” Sometimes I will set a goal during my prayer time to stay and pray longer. When I have the thought to stop praying and go do something else, I will commit to stay and pray even longer. Then when the thought comes again, I will stay even longer. Earnestly, seriously, and diligently I keep praying and seeking God. Often, something very special happens when I do this. I enter into that place where the love of God begins to overwhelm me. At times, tears will stream down my face as I am being touched in a personal way by God. During these times, I begin to realize that my thoughts and prayers are directed in a different way. I become so aware of God being present, at that moment that my prayers begin to get filled with faith! Consider setting a goal today to stay in prayer a little longer, earnestly seeking God until He is found. Perhaps you could set a goal to try this every day for a week or even a month. What about for a lifetime? Our verse says He “rewards” those who earnestly seek Him.
