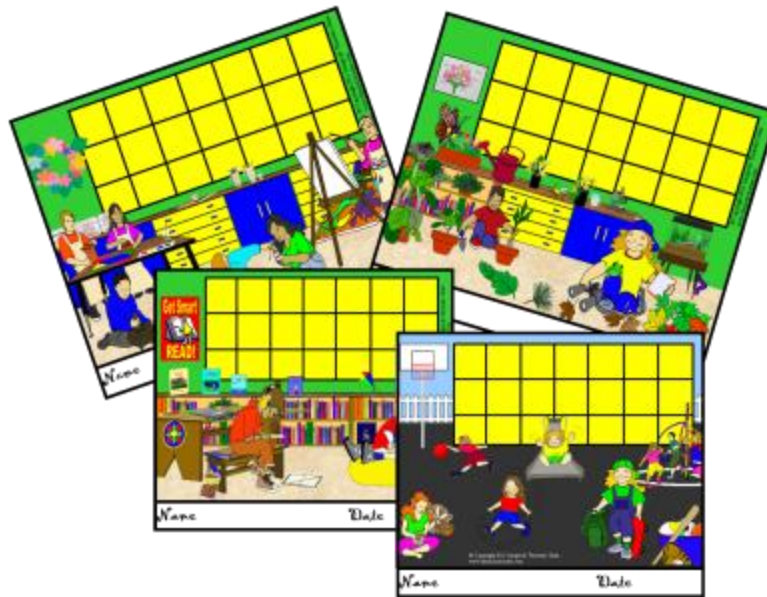


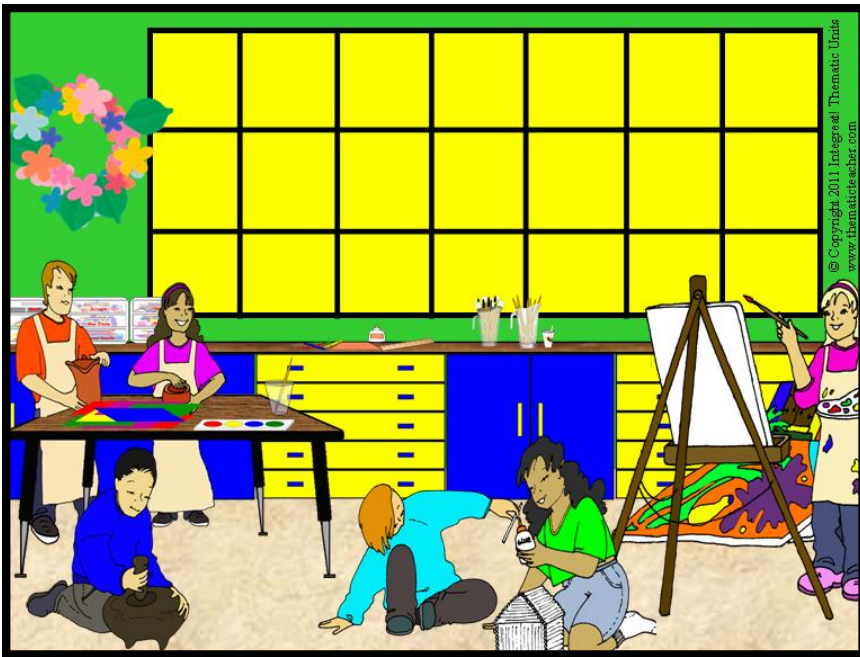
# The Artful Classroom: Incentive Charts

Use these colorful incentive charts to help your kids achieve in difficult areas. Run them off on heavy white drawing paper, cover stock, or tag, and tape them on your student's desk, in their folder, or on a clipboard. Every time he accomplishes the required task, give him a ½ inch sticker, or let him stamp or draw in one of the boxes. When the chart is full, he gets his reward.

You can personalize the charts by selecting "Name" and "Date" and retyping your student's name and the correct date and then print them out. (This only works on the Microsoft® Word version.) Or you may simply write the name and date in by hand after you print the charts out.

To get some free stickers, ask your parents to send in some of those address labels they get from charity organizations. Cut the images off and they'll fit perfectly, and cost you nothing!





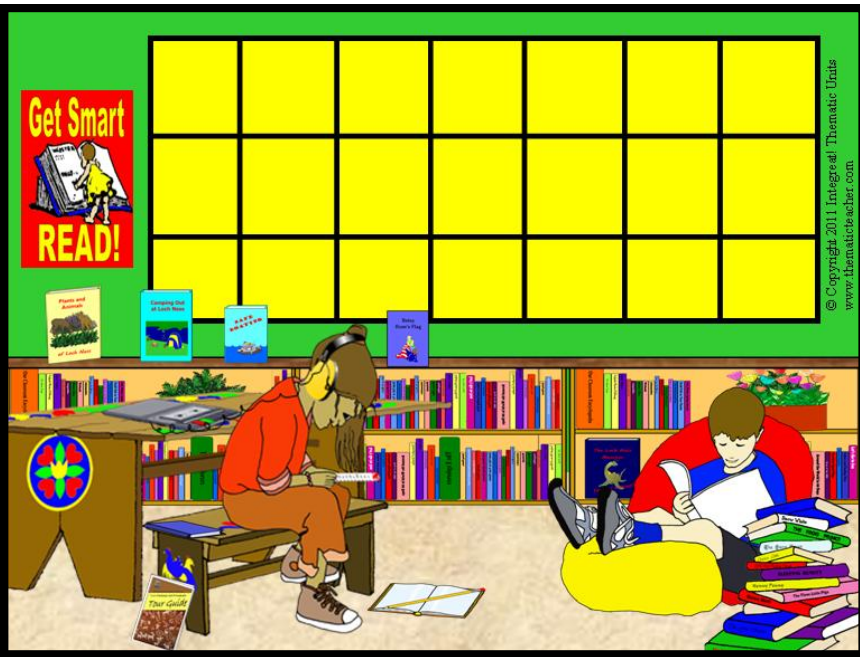
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
