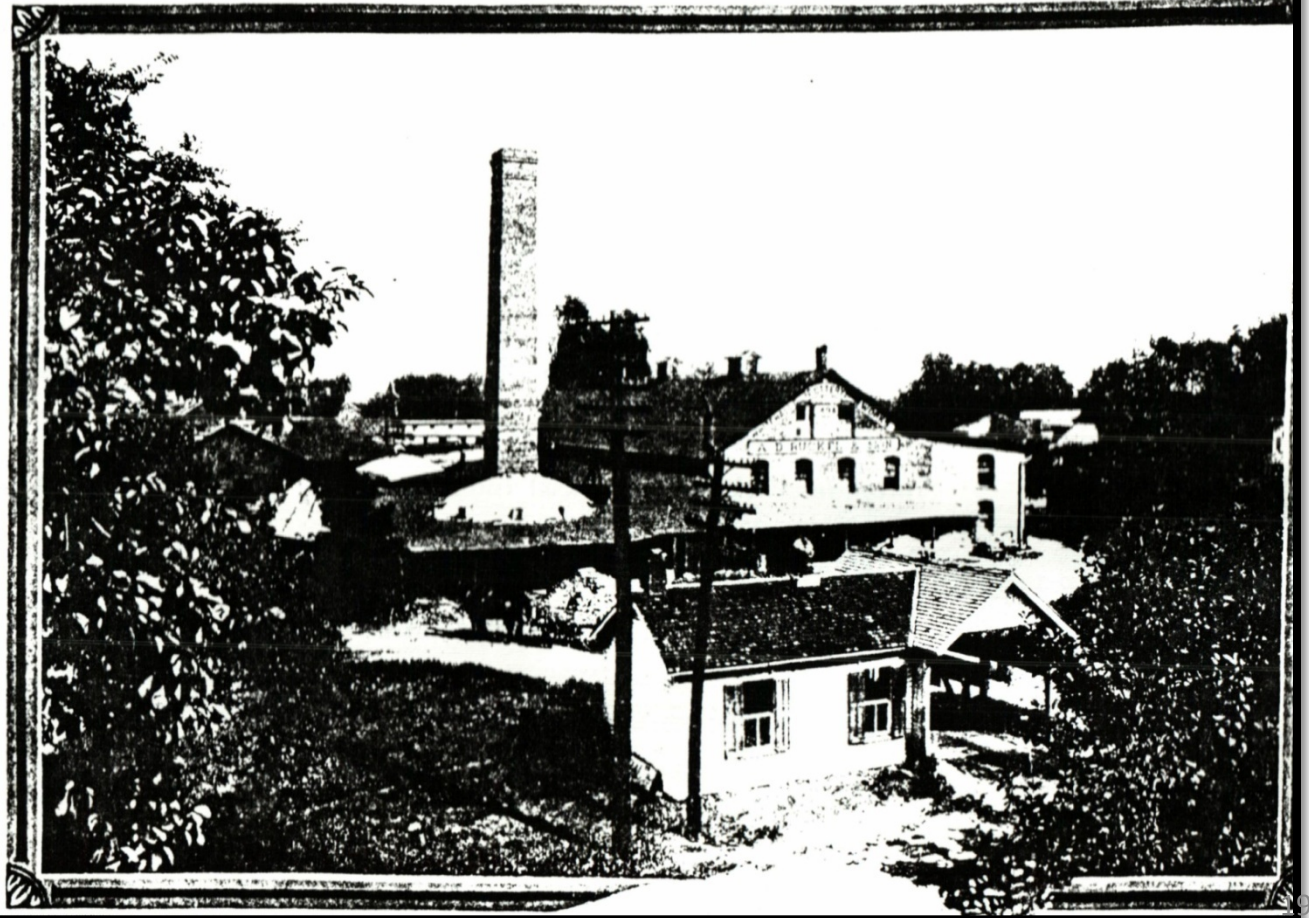


THE FACTORY WORKERS
