Brethren,



I regret to inform you that the El Paso Scottish Rite Temple sustained some wall damage from the windstorm on Sunday, February 23, 2023. The wall façade by the back door that leads into our back parking lot, was completely destroyed and torn away from the building. There was no possible way to salvage the wall or any of the materials.

We will not have any issues or leaks due to the damage and the façade was purely for aesthetic reasons. You can tell by the pictures that the façade was simply a cosmetic attempt at disguising the portion of our building that was not brick. We also had two cameras knocked down and the outside light above the back door was destroyed.

Or in-house clean up crew spent the entire day Monday, February 27, 2023 cleaning up, hauling away the debris and reinstalling cameras and the light. A big thanks to our clean-up and fix-up crew consisting of:

At some point we will get the Board of Directors together and decide on a cause of action. One idea was to stucco the bare wall that was hidden by the façade and another suggestion was to just pain the bare wall.
