ANNOUNCEMENT #2 SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION COURSE FOR YOUTH

On February 24, 2019, Saint Mary Star of the Sea Parish, Port Townsend will offer one sexual abuse prevention course to your youth. In our efforts to protect our vulnerable

population, the Archdiocese of Seattle has integrated abuse prevention material into our faith formation and youth ministry curriculum in the context of teaching our youth about our Catholic faith.

In creating a safe space for our youth, we can teach and show them the ways of Christ in a safe environment conducive to learning. Keeping our minors and vulnerable adult's safe starts with you. We ask that you take part in this effort in extending the Archbishop's effort to help evangelize our youth in a safe space. To help you understand what your youth will be offered, we ask you to visit: http://www.seattlearchdiocese.org/SEP/faithformation.aspx. This will provide you with "Parent/Guardian Resources," to inform you about the curriculum being used while also making available the actual lessons. Additionally, we have placed copies of the document titled, "Teaching Boundaries and Safety Guide", on the religious education sign-in table for your review.

As the guardian, you have the right to opt your child/youth out of this lesson. You may do so by clicking on the link "Opting Out." You are asked to complete this form and submit it to your child(ren)s Catechetical Leader. This announcement is to notify you of our new initiative to provide abuse prevention curriculum to our youth in Faith Formation/Youth Ministry. Unless you would like to opt your youth out of this lesson you are not required to do anything.



THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC **CHURCH**

The Last Judgement §1040-1041

1040 The Last Judgment will come

when Christ returns in glory. Only the Father knows the day and the hour; only he determines the moment of its coming. Then through his Son Jesus Christ he will pronounce the final word on all history. We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end. The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death.

1041 The message of the Last Judgment calls men to conversion while God is still giving them "the acceptable time, . . . the day of salvation." It inspires a holy fear of God and commits them to the justice of the Kingdom of God. It proclaims the "blessed hope" of the Lord's return, when he will come "to be glorified in his saints, and to be marveled at in all who have believed."

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA

El Juicio final **§1040-1041**

1040 El Juicio final sucederá cuando vuelva Cristo glorioso. Sólo el Padre conoce el día y la hora en que tendrá lugar; sólo Él decidirá su advenimiento. Entonces Él pronunciará por medio de su Hijo Jesucristo, su palabra definitiva sobre toda la historia. Nosotros conoceremos el sentido último de toda la obra de la creación y de toda la economía de la salvación, y comprenderemos los caminos admirables por los que su Providencia habrá conducido todas las cosas a su fin último. El Juicio final revelará que la justicia de Dios triunfa de todas las injusticias cometidas por sus criaturas y que su amor es más fuerte que la muerte (cf. Ct 8, 6).

1041 El mensaje del Juicio final llama a la conversión mientras Dios da a los hombres todavía "el tiempo favorable, el tiempo de salvación" (2 Co 6, 2). Inspira el santo temor de Dios. Compromete para la justicia del Reino de Dios. Anuncia la "bienaventurada esperanza" (Tt 2, 13) de la vuelta del Señor que "vendrá para ser glorificado en sus santos y admirado en todos los que hayan creído" (2 Ts 1, 10).

SAINTS JACINTA AND FRANCISCO MARTO -The Children of Fatima Feast day February 20

Beginning on May 13, 917, the Blessed Lady chose to appear to three

very young and unremarkable children. Mary asked the children to return to that spot on the thirteenth of each month for the next six months. She also asked them to learn to read and write and to pray the rosary, "to obtain peace for the world; an end of the war; for sinners and for the conversion of Russia." Through these experiences the two youngest, Francisco Marto 9 and his sister Jacinta 7, began a gradual progress along their unique paths of sanctity. They provided a rare and remarkable example of young children living a life of heroic virtue which is not usually associated with those so young. Their prayers and sacrifices were offered to console God and honor the Mother of the Lord. In responding totally to Mary's requests they became children who wanted to please God and did so through the simple but available means in their lives. In August 1918, just as World War I was ending, Francisco and his sister both contracted influenza. Francisco died of influenza in his family home and Jacinta died in Lisbon in 1920, offering their suffering for the conversion of sinners, peace in the world, and the Holy Father. Our Lady did not choose the rich and famous for her purposes yet through the merits of these otherwise insignificant children many people have come to change their lives because of the message of Our Lady of Fátima. St. Francisco and Jacinta prayer for us.
