Report from Southern Luzon, Philippines

Dear Mama Ruth & Papa Ed,

When we came to San Antonio, Minalabac Seventh-day Adventist Church on Wednesday there should have been brethren there for midweek prayer meeting since it was already 7:00 p.m. but the church was closed. According to the brethren, the church was closed about two years ago with no mid-week prayer meeting, no Sabbath worship service or vespers. We were so sad and the group decided to work for the revival of the church.

There were problems; some of the brethren are playing lottery like "tong-it," and other card games. We always pray to God that He will change their attitude for they are His children. As the ground prepara-



tion was going on we saw changes. They stopped their habit in joining the lottery. They helped us in house-to-D house visitation and inviting their friends to attend nightly meetings. We always kneel before God and work as a team. The ladies, work under Judy's leadership. They do the cooking, hold VBS for the children and other activities. My friend Bong and I were the Bible workers for the area. Pastor Garrado was our nightly

speaker. At the end of the campaign, by God's grace, 25 precious souls

were added to the church and the brethren were revived.

Now we are planning to hold a campaign in Bagolatao, the next barangay (village) from San Antonio, only 4 kilometres away. We have two purposes; first to nurture and strengthen the San Antonio Seventh -day Adventist Church and second, to impart God's good news of salvation and build another church near that barangay.



We hope that God will provide all our needs for this campaign.

May our God help each one of us and bless the work of our hands for His glory.

(There are many willing workers in the Philippines. They just need a little help for transportation, food and materials. It is so hard to turn down these willing workers.)

San Lorenzo School Update

Earthquake Drills, Death Threats and Graduation

Our little indigenous school tucked away in the mountains of Chiapas, Mexico continues doing every-

thing possible to provide a wholesome Christian education to promising children. Pathfinder activities and community outreach projects have resulted in leading many families to Jesus.





Because of frequent earthquakes in that area, the Mexican government implemented a simulated earthquake drill,





complete with rescue helicopter, safety training and first responder measures.

On a different note, vandals broke into the school office just after school dismissed for Spring Break. Papers and books were scattered, and original student documents were stolen. The school principal filed a report with the police, who began investigating. Five days later the missing documents, wet and tattered, appeared on





the grass in front of the principal's house. An ominous note was scribbled on the folder: "Don't try to find me, or *else your children will die.*" Thankfully the documents were dried out and nothing else has happened. Certainly the enemy is unhappy, but God is ultimately in control.

Twenty-two students graduated on

June 30, and plans for the next school year include a classroom with 15 computers (\$7,000) and a sturdy office with a safe for school documents (\$6,000). Your donations are helping to pay teacher salaries at San Lorenzo, and the students & staff there have expressed their sincere appreciation for the way in which you are helping to change young lives - for eternity!
