

**†SAINTS/FEASTS OF THE WEEK†**

**Sept. 12-The Most Holy Name of Mary**-A feast which originated in Spain commemorating the privileges give to Mary by God and also all the graces that we receive through Mary through her intercession and mediation.

**Sept. 13-St. Chrysostom**-Known for his preaching and public speaking, St. Chrysostom (which means "golden-mouthed") was an important early Church Father. Unfortunately, due to his honesty and courage, he paid the price of a turbulent ministry as bishop, personal vilification, and exile.

**Sept. 14-The Exaltation of the Holy Cross**-As the symbol most associated with Jesus and his Church, this feast day celebrates two important events ... The discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena and the dedication of the Basilica and shrine built by Emperor Constantine (St. Helena's son), on Calvary, marking the site of the Crucifixion .

**Sept. 15-Our Lady of Sorrows**-This feast day commemorates the seven sorrows, or dolors: (1) The Dark Prophecy of Simeon; (2) The flight of the Holy Family into Egypt; (3) The child Jesus is lost to Mary and Joseph; (4) The sorrowful meeting of Jesus and Mary; (5) The Crucifixion and death of Jesus; (6) Jesus is taken down from the cross; and (7) Jesus is buried in the tomb.

**There are SEVEN PROMISES that God grants to those who honor The Blessed Virgin Mother daily by saying seven Hail Marys while contemplating her tears and sorrows during her life. This devotion was passed on to us by St. Bridget.**

1. "I will grant Peace to their families."
2. "They will be enlightened about the Divine Mysteries."
3. "I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work."
4. "I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my Divine Son or the sanctification of their souls."
5. "I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives."
6. "I will visibly help them at the moment of their death, they will see the face of their mother."
7. "I have obtained (This Grace) from my Divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and dolors, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son will be their eternal consolation and joy."


O God of consolation,

# Hace oír a los sordos y hablar a los mudos

## 9 de septiembre de 2018 • Vigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

No solo a veces mostramos poco cuidado por el planeta y su belleza, sino que nos resistimos al mandamiento de Dios de cuidarnos unos a otros en nuestras necesidades. Santiago nos advierte que no debemos dar el lugar de honor a quienes parecen y son ricos. Él señala a los necesitados, a los andrajosos, y nos advierte que debemos cuidar de ellos y que no los despreciemos, pues Dios ve sus necesidades y su confianza en Dios y amor por sus prójimos. Es por ellos por quien Jesús vino a sanar y darles esperanza.

De manera similar, en la lectura de Isaías, la venida de Dios está acompañada por la apertura de los oídos de los sordos y los ojos a los ciegos. Dios viene para hacer que el cojo salte y el mudo cante. (Entonces, todos, por favor canten en la iglesia. ¡Esto da gloria a Dios!)

### SÉ ABIERTO

Jesús vino para dar esperanza a los más pequeños, aquellos que no podrían cumplir las leyes de los fariseos como mantener comida Kosher guardada en recipientes separados, etc., porque eran pobres y no podían tener cosas dobles. Ellos

no podían pagar doctores o remedios de aquellos tiempos. Pero Jesús les dio esperanza.

Una persona que estaba coja o muda no tenía forma de hacerse "normal" en aquellos días. Pero Jesús tiene misericordia de aquellas personas necesitadas, y él sanó al sordo y al mudo y los restauró a su comunidad.

¿De qué manera nos falta la fe o esperanza de que seremos sanados por Cristo? A menudo olvidamos lo mucho que Dios nos ama y que tan cerca está Dios de nosotros cada día? Si tan solo pudiéramos recordar esto, no tendríamos miedo, no nos sentiríamos inadecuados en nuestros tratos con el mundo, ni nos faltaría el valor para proteger nuestro mundo de la destrucción.

Dios nos ama más allá de cualquier amor que pudiéramos comprender, y está listo para sanar todas nuestras heridas y bendecirnos con los dones de una fe segura, esperanza firme y amor por cada uno en Cristo.



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Back to work we go! Summer break is over and there is much to accomplish in school and in the workplace. It's a venerable Catholic custom to assign patron saints to the trades and occupations of life. This is largely in the realm of popular devotion, and although from time to time the Vatican declares a saint to be patron of this or that, the process is free-wheeling and just about uncontrollable. Still, there is a saint for almost any purpose, whether you are on death row (Dismas), having eye trouble (Lucy), or pursued by poisonous toads (Hubert). Medieval guilds would often associate themselves with heavenly patrons, so Saint Joseph has the carpenters, Thomas More the lawyers, and physicians get Saint Luke. If you're stuck in the airport, St. Joseph of Cupertino is on call since he was said to rise off the floor when he prayed, and if you're in a long line at the ATM, Saint Anthony Claret is for you.

In recent years, the Vatican has from time to time assigned a new patronage, as when Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was named the patron of HIV-AIDS patients, since as a young Jesuit novice he had cared for his fellow novices during a terrible plague. Anything that matters to us—nation, parish church, occupation, illness—can have a patron, and it is an aspect of Catholicism that has enormous appeal. To believe in the “communion of saints” is to know that the ties that bind us as a communion do not unravel with death, and that when we stand before life's struggles, we do not stand alone. ## SEE BEYOND OUTWARD APPEARANCES

The phrase “Sunday best” has lost much of its meaning in our society today. Some lament the loss of people dressing up for church on Sunday; others think it's a healthy sign that we're as casual in attire gathered before the Lord as we are elsewhere. No matter which school of thought on this topic we belong to, James would probably chastise us. In either case, we are still focused on external appearance, mistaking it for some sort of favored position before God. True, James criticizes the community that favors the rich and well-dressed while ostracizing the poorly clothed, but even more he criticizes the making of distinctions, making choices based on criteria that having nothing to do with the reign of God. James might turn our attention to the reign of God described by Isaiah, in which people are healed and the earth becomes ripe to bear fruit. Jesus today is focused on this reign of God, healing a Gentile man in a region hostile to his Jewish faith, not mindful of the man's origins or clothing or status or ability to repay. Isaiah, James, and Jesus in Mark's Gospel all call us to look more deeply to find where the will of God needs to be done, and has been done, on earth as in heaven. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

## TODAY'S READINGS

**First Reading** — Be strong, fear not! Here is your God (Isaiah 35:4-7a).

**Psalms** — Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).
