



So, if you know of anyone that could benefit from SAABE, please feel free to let us know. Great food, fellowship and seminars for continuing education are some of the benefits that we have to offer.

This month's seminar was given by Will Fawcett with Joe W. Fly Company. The seminar was directed towards the importance of filtration. Now, I know that everyone out there is probably going "I know what filters are and what their purpose is," but let me tell you, this seminar was very educational.

So ask yourself, "Why is filtration important?" Well, there are four reasons: 1. To protect your equipment; 2. To protect your environment; 3. To protect your product; and 4. **To protect your occupants**.

Also discussed was the MERV (Minimum Efficiency Reporting Value) percentage of filters. A regular filter has a MERV percentage of 7 or 8. Installing a filter with a MERV percentage of 14 or 15 will reduce airborne irritants - irritants that can lead to headaches, respiratory problems and other problems.


