1	<p>Nine Wing: The Idealist* They have a greater ability to relax and unwind without having to go on vacation, are less reactive when they disagree with someone, and are more likely to solicit the opinions of others rather than relying primarily on their own judgments or those of others whom they respect.**</p>	<p>Two Wing: The Advocate They are more consistently generous and people-focused, gregarious, and display more consistent warmth to others.</p>
2	<p>One Wing: The Servant They balance their focus on people with a dedication to task, are more discerning about situations and people, pay more attention to detail, and have an increased ability to be firm and say no, with far less worry about how others will react to them when they assert themselves in this way.</p>	<p>Three Wing: The Hostess/Host They are more comfortable being visible, such as holding a high-profile leadership position. In addition, they feel more comfortable acknowledging their desire to be successful, They often pursue being respected as much as being liked.</p>
3	<p>Two Wing: The Charmer They are more sensitive to the feelings of others and more generous with their time and resources, and they often focus on helping others in their professional and/or personal lives.</p>	<p>Four Wing: The Professional They are more in contact with their own feelings, are willing to engage in emotional conversation with others, have a deeper personal experience, and may engage in some form of artistic expression or refined level of artistic appreciation.</p>
4	<p>Three Wing: The Aristocrat They are more action oriented, have higher and more consistent energy levels, exhibit more poise and confidence, and are more comfortable with being highly visible rather than shying away from visibility or feeling ambivalent about it.</p>	<p>Five Wing: The Bohemian They are more objective and analytical, which provides a counterpoint to their more subjective emotional way of relating with others. In addition, they have an increased ability to perceive situations from a more considered and less reactive perspective and often demonstrate more self-restraint and self-containment.</p>
5	<p>Four Wing: The Iconoclast They are more emotionally sensitive and expressive and also have an aesthetic perspective, perhaps engaging in the arts themselves; for example, writing poetry, novels, or screenplays, and/or being photographers or artists.</p>	<p>Six Wing: The Problem Solver They emphasize and engage more readily with teams, tend to place greater value on loyalty, and may have enhanced intuitive insight. Their insights come more from putting facts together and engaging in extensive analysis, and come more quickly as the product of instantaneous processing.</p>
6	<p>Five Wing: The Defender They are more internally than externally focused and are more self-contained and restrained, thus tempering their tendency to be reactive. They have an increased passion for knowledge and use the pursuit of knowledge not only to gather information in order to feel prepared, but also for the pure enjoyment of learning.</p>	<p>Seven Wing: The Buddy It is sometimes said that Sixes see the glass as half empty and Sevens see it as half full. Thus, when Sixes with Seven wing see the whole glass and therefore tend to be more cheerful, less worried, more optimistic, and higher-energy.</p>
7	<p>Six Wing: The Entertainer This wing adds the capacity to understand situations as being both half full and half empty. Because these Sevens have an increased perceptiveness and an ability to anticipate potential problems, their actions become more deliberate and less based on their instantaneous reactions.</p>	<p>Eight Wing: The Realist They tend to be more direct, assertive, and powerful. They have a more grounded presence and an increased desire to put ideas into action.</p>
8	<p>Seven Wing: The Maverick This wing adds lightheartedness. They are more high-spirited and independent, and tend to be more adventurous, willing to try new things in their personal and professional lives for the sake of experimentation and enjoyment.</p>	<p>Nine Wing: The Bear They are interpersonally warmer, calmer, and less reactive. They solicit and listen to others' opinions because they are more consensually oriented.</p>
9	<p>Eight Wing: The Referee They have a more take-charge orientation, exhibiting a solidity and forcefulness while still maintaining a desire to hear others' opinions. They assert their own points of view more readily and make fast and clear decisions, even in the face of strong opposition.</p>	<p>One Wing: The Dreamer They are more attentive. They pay more attention to details and are more punctual and precise. Although Nines often diffuse their attention, One wing increases their overall focus, acuity, clarity, and discernment.</p>
