General Rules for Exhibit Open Class:

- 1) Exhibitors may enter only two items in each class per person.
- 2) An entry form must be completely filled out for all entries.
- 3) All items must be produced or prepared within the current fair year (August 2023-August 2024)
- 4) Entries are limited to Beaver County residents. Non-residents may enter items as display only.
- 5) The Beaver County Fair Board will not be responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged items. All reasonable means will be taken to prevent loss or damage.
- 6) All items will be received from 2:00pm to 7:00pm on Tuesday, August 20th, at the Fairgrounds, with the exception of produce and flower entries, which will be accepted on Wednesday, August 21 8:00am-11:00am.
- 7) Judging of entries will be on Wednesday, August 21st
- 8) The exhibit building will be open on Thursday, August 24th from 3:00pm-7:00pm, Friday, August 23rd from 1:00pm-7:30pm, and Saturday, August 22nd from 10:00am-7:00pm
- 9) Exhibits will be judged and ribbons awarded in blue or red ribbons. Cash premiums of \$3.00 for blue ribbons and \$2.00 for red ribbons will be awarded.
- 10) Rosette ribbons will be awarded \$15.00 for Grand Champion, and \$10 for Reserve Champion or Judges Choice. There is a \$50.00 maximum on premium money awarded for open class exhibits, excluding rosette premiums. All items not claimed will become the property of the Beaver County Fair Board.

Darrell and Geneal Yardley are honored to serve as Grand Marshals for the Beaver County Fair in 2024. Darrell was born and raised in Beaver. After graduating from Beaver High School he attended the College of Southern Utah and served a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Central Atlantic States Mission. After returning home, he joined the National Guard and continued his schooling, graduating with a degree in Elementary Education. He taught school one year in Tooele, Utah then returned to Beaver County where he taught third/fourth grades in Minersville. After teaching school for two years, Darrell attended Brigham Young University for a master's degree in Curriculum and Instruction and a certificate in Special Education. Coming home to Beaver, he taught Special Education at Belknap Elementary for 30 years. He enjoyed teaching students to read and do math. After school and during the summers, he took care of his farm and cattle. Geneal was born in Arizona, graduated from Duncan High School then graduated from BYU as a Home Economics teacher. After graduating she came to Beaver where she taught Home Economics for one year and served a mission in Argentina, South America. Returning to Beaver after her mission, she and Darrell met through a variety of school and church activities and married in 1972. They started their family

which includes Evan (Julie Ann) Yardley, Neal Yardley, Julieann Parkin, Brian (Robyn) Yardley, Diane (Spencer) Waite, and Brent (Abby) Yardley. They have 19 grandchildren and 6 great-grandchildren. Geneal was a 4-H leader in various projects such as cooking, sewing, entomology, and photography with her children. After the children were in high school, Geneal earned her Elementary Teaching Endorsement and taught Title I and work as a special education aide for about 12 years.

After Darrell retired, Geneal and Darrell served a proselyting mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Texas Lubbock Mission. Since their mission, Darrell continues to be involved in the family farm caring for cows and putting up hay. Darrell has been the secretary for the South Enders Grazing Association for many years and has been on the Soil Conservation District Board for 12 years. Recently he joined the Ag Protection Board. Geneal is active in DUP and Patchwork Pals Quilt Guild. When Geneal was young, she was active in 4-H and always liked to enter projects in the county fair. She was surprised when she moved to Beaver that there was not a county fair. Pam McMullin along with the Utah State Extension Service under Grant Esplin and Miriam Limb started the Beaver County Fair. Geneal was involved first with 4-H entries and then with the photography department. The last 12 years she has helped with the quilt department. She has seen the Beaver County Fair grow from a small beginning to the event it is today with many activities to involve Beaver County residents of all ages. Darrell and Geneal are pleased to associate with all the dedicated people who serve to make the Beaver County Fair such a wonderful event.
