

A Message From Your Potentate

Dear Nobles and Ladies,

As our children grew older and we had more time, I joined the Shrine, then the Clowns, and now here it is 20 years later.

In 2021, we will emphasize Fun,

Fellowship, and Philanthropy. We will need to get creative on how we accomplish this during the COVID-19 pandemic. Limitations on the size of gatherings, social distancing, and masks have all become our new norms. We have to invent mechanisms to be able to share fellowship and have fun while at the same time, following these new safety precautions to keep everyone safe and healthy. Meeting these challenges represent opportunities for us to grow as we find new ways of doing things. Although it is time of uncertainty and nothing like any of us have ever seen, we can't be paralyzed by fear. Past Imperial Potentate Freeland Kendrick from Lu Lu Shriners in Philadelphia was not paralyzed by fear in the middle of the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918 that lasted from February 1918 thru April 1920 when he brought the idea of establishing hospitals for children to the membership of Shriners in 1919. The result of that idea created the Greatest Philanthropy in the world - Shriners Hospitals for Children which to date has treated more than 1.3 million children without regard to the patient's ability to pay. That is the kind of courage and creativity that we will need to employ to accomplish good things in 2021.

Membership growth is always a goal of our organization. With the restrictions imposed by the Grand Lodge of Kansas on performing degree work, we need to shift our focus from seeking new Shriners from the ranks of those who are uninitiated into Blue Lodge, to seeking new Shriners from the men who are already Master Masons. Additionally, we will need to focus on re-engaging our current Shrine membership. I would ask that the Nobility reach out to any members who you haven't seen for awhile. Ask

them what we can do to see them more often at our events. We need to cultivate an environment where everyone feels welcome, respected, safe, and included.

Fun and fellowship often go hand in hand. If you're having fun, it's often because of the people you are with. There are many events scheduled from fundraisers to parties, and the Nobility Ball to the hospital screening clinic. There are also travel opportunities that begin in the summer and extend into the fall if that peaks your interest. Check the calendar to identify the scheduled events that interest you and come on out. If there is an event that you would like to see on the calendar that isn't listed, reach out to me or any Divan member to share your ideas and suggestions.

Russell Simmons said, "Surround yourself with people who are smarter than you." And Albert Einstein said, "I don't need to know everything, I just need to know where to find it, when I need it." I am fortunate that previous Potentates have appointed Divan members who are smarter than I am, and the new guys that I've appointed to the Divan in 2021, are all smarter than I am too, so much like Einstein, "I don't need to know everything," I just need to know who to ask, and I feel grateful to have such a strong group of members (both past and present) in Arab Shrine who are willing to share their knowledge

I am very much looking forward to serving as your Potentate in 2021. I can promise that I will do my best. Let's have some fun in 2021.





Among the many things that make our health care system stand out is its commitment to compassionate, family-centered care.


A girl from Lincoln, Nebraska, is among those who have been able to pursue their goals and become more independent by using customized adaptive technology. Poppy, 11, was born missing the lower portion of her left arm.

She has a prosthetic arm provided by Shriners Children's Twin Cities that she uses for a wide variety of activities. Her hobbies range from football, softball and soccer to dance, playing the guitar, acting and creating art. To help with her activities, Poppy can add attachments to her prosthetic arm. For example, she has a flat disk for push-ups or cartwheels and a small pointer for playing the guitar. Rhonda Revelle, head coach for the University of Nebraska Huskers softball team, saw a story about Poppy and was inspired by the girl's positivity and "can do" attitude. So, she invited

Poppy to attend a softball practice. Coach Revelle's team was so amazed by Poppy's abilities that they invited her to serve as the batgirl for several games.

"It's okay to be different and do the things that you love,"

Poppy said. "If you're a girl and you want to play football, then go ahead and do it. And if you want to do other stuff that people say you can't, just go for it, because anything is possible if you just do it and you try your best."

That’s the new push for this Imperial year and beyond. The idea is called “Build Your Own Experience,” said Bryan Harrison, the fraternity’s chief membership development officer. While other organizations, including Freemasonry, offer a more predetermined and uniform experience for all members, Shriners International is set up to enable nobles to be creative. “We’ve never focused on this aspect of our fraternity before,” Harrison said.

The opportunities for nobles — and prospective nobles — to enjoy fun and fellowship are numerous. “And we may not have a thing you’re interested in,” Harrison said, “but we could!”

Imperial Sir Matt Sturlaugson, who is chairman of the Membership Committee, agrees. “We don’t have to push nobles into an existing mold,” Sturlaugson said. “Instead, we let them create what they want and we support them through it.”

In this way, buy-in comes naturally from the temples, and groups grow organically. As an example, Sturlaugson described a group at El Zagal Shriners that enjoys camping. It all started, he said, when a couple of Past Potentates were chatting about recreational vehicles. Conversations grew about where folks were planning to go and when, which then

broadened into where to stay, who would bring food, who would bring firewood, and more.

“At the last event,” Sturlaugson said, “a dozen families that are formally part of the group attended, plus others. And it all started with two guys talking about something they both enjoy.”

In his role as Membership Chairman, Sturlaugson is keenly aware of the need to recruit and retain new nobles. As the fraternity’s numbers decrease, “There is no easy ‘just fix this’ type of answer,” he said. “The nobility is aware of this, and it can be hard to stay positive.”

Shooting with the Clay Busters

Things You Need to Know When Purchasing a Shotgun

I am frequently asked about shotguns. Should I buy this one? What about that one? Is this a good deal? Choosing the right shotgun is not as simple as Hollywood would have you think. The factors that go into your decision are many and it is important to be educated about what is available before you part ways with your hard-earned cash. The price can range from a few hundred to a few thousand dollars. Let us take a few minutes and look at some of the points you need to consider.

The **first** consideration is the gauge of the shotgun. The term gauge is an incredibly old school English method of determining the diameter of a barrel. "Gauge is determined from the weight of a solid sphere of lead that will fit the bore of the firearm and is expressed as the multiplicative inverse of the sphere's weight as a fraction of a pound, e.g., a one-twelfth pound lead ball fits a 12-gauge bore." – Wikipedia. Yeah... makes perfect sense. Regardless, the smaller the number, the fewer lead balls it would take to equal a pound, hence, the larger the bore of the barrel.

While there are several options, there are three that are most common. The exception to the lead-ball measurement is the 410 which is measured in diameter – like a pistol diameter. The 410 is a small shotgun shell and is used for small game primarily, e.g. squirrels. Second up is

one I see quite a bit and that is the 28-gauge shotgun. This is a capable and effective shotgun that can be used for target shooting as well as hunting quail. It is generally lighter and produces less recoil. The next one up is the 20-gauge and is similar to the 28 but with slightly more oomph. The 16-gauge was at one



time popular for game and birds including pheasants. The 16-gauge has fallen from popularity and finding shotgun shells for a 16 is getting increasingly difficult. The most popular of shotguns is the 12-gauge. The 12-gauge shotgun is the primary gun in the self-defense, law enforcement, skeet, trap, sporting clays, and hunting. It enjoys a wide variety of ammunition options and can be fun to shoot. The granddaddy of them all is the 10-gauge. This is primarily used for waterfowl and if you can handle the recoil, it can be used for other game as well.

The **second** decision you need to make is the type of action you want in a shotgun. There are basically three options for shotgun actions with variances of each: pump, semi-automatic, and the double barrel. The classic pump action shotgun is the most common style and has a reputation of being exceptionally reliable. These guns tend to be very affordable and are easy to cycle. It is exceedingly rare to get a jam with a pump and with practice the gun can perform almost as fast as a semi-auto. The second type is the semi-auto. Like semi-auto rifles and handguns, these guns use gas blowback to cycle the action. That action reduces felt recoil and the tasks a shooter must execute just pressing the trigger. These guns can be fired very quickly and are popular in competition and in the field. The fact that they are not as reliable as pump guns however makes them a more challenging choice for home defense. The third type is the classic double barrel shotgun. These can be a side by side or an over and under. Regardless their application is limited due to the fact you only have two shots. They are exceedingly popular for shooting skeet and sporting clays. They don't however fit many applications beyond that very well.

The **third** consideration is your shooting needs. What you want the shotgun for? Are you hunting, looking for personal protection or both? As a rule of thumb hunting

guns tend to have longer barrels, e.g. 30 inches, as this aids with hitting a moving target. Self-defense shotguns tend to have short barrels, e.g. 18 inches, and can be set up to accept lights and special optics. If you are going to be hunting in extreme weather conditions, then a synthetic stock is the way to go. If you are going to be shooting targets or hunting during good weather days, wood stocks are worth consideration. Wood stocks can be beautiful and a work of art. You can get a gun that may serve both personal protection and hunting, but I would suggest one for each.

The **fourth decision** is fit. Yes, I said fit! Based on body size, type, and right or left-handed the different manufactures will fit better than others. The fit of the gun is the biggest determining factor in having fun in the field or a dud. The correct fit will allow you to pull up square to the target as opposed to be bladded out or searching for the target. The one that fits you best will allow you to correctly seat the shotgun in the pocket of your shoulder. Without this fit your arm or collarbone will pay the price. A good fit will allow you to effortlessly look down the barrel without moving your head. This allows you to focus on the target and not look at the bead on the end of the barrel.

If you noticed, I did not mention price as a consideration for purchasing a shotgun. This is the least of all considerations. If the shotgun is purchased at a competitive price, it can be sold later for pretty well the same money. Many enthusiasts say when purchasing a firearm, they are “taking money out of the bank and putting it in the safe.” The lifetime cost of shotgun ownership is negligible.

While you may have thought you would just go to the local gun dealer and get a shotgun, you now see there are things to weigh before you make the purchase. Shotguns are like books; you can't have too many. You have a fantastic variety of options and if you choose wisely you can get a gun that you will enjoy shooting for years!

Shriners Hospitals wants children and families to “Be Burn Aware”

Burn Awareness Week kicks off annual campaign

February 7-13, 2020 is Burn Awareness Week. During this time, Shriners Hospitals for Children will promote its annual burn awareness and prevention campaign. Since the 1960s, Shriners Hospitals for Children has been a leader in burn care, research, and education, and burn injury prevention is a key component in these efforts.

This year’s effort will complement the theme *Contact Burns – Hot Surfaces Damage Skin* from the American Burn Association, which focuses on preventing children from receiving hot surface burn injuries. According to data from the Massachusetts Burn Injury Reporting System (M-BIRS), children under 5 account for one-quarter of all reported burn injuries in the state. In the past ten years, 45% of all contact burns were to children under 5. Touching heating and cooking equipment, other hot household items (like clothes irons), and walking barefoot on hot pavement are the leading causes of contact burns to young children.

“Many of the burn injuries we see each year occur as a result of accidents in and around the home,” said [Robert L. Sheridan, M.D.](#), interim chief of staff and chief of burn surgery at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston. “Recognizing Burn Awareness Week each February is an important part of our mission to educate the public about burn injuries and reinforce the initiatives Shriners Hospitals for Children promotes throughout the year in hopes of preventing burn injuries before they happen.”

Keep your children injury-free by remembering these important prevention tips, recently published by the [Massachusetts Department of Fire Services](#):

Prevent contact burns:

Indoors, supervise children around space heaters, woodstoves, fireplaces, radiators, and stoves and ovens in use. Keep them three feet away from things that can get hot by using baby gates, highchairs, and playpens.

- Outdoors, keep children three feet away from barbecue grills and campfires. Keep area clear of trip hazards so no one falls into the fire.

- Turn heating pads, electric blankets, and space heaters off before sleeping.

- Have hot pads available whenever cooking. Long oven mitts are best when needing to reach in or over hot surfaces, such as inside an oven or over a grill. Assume all pots and pans are hot before touching.

- Remember to treat items coming from the microwave as you would items from the oven. Make sure children are taller than the microwave and supervise them using it.

Protect your feet by wearing shoes when walking on hot pavement or sand and keep pets off hot pavement too.

Hot drink safety:

- Never hold or carry a child while you have a hot drink in your hand. A wiggling baby can cause a spill on herself or on you.

- Consider using a “travel mug” with a tight-fitting lid to prevent or minimize spills.

- Keep hot drinks and soups away from the edge of tables and counters. Putting them in the center of the table keeps them away from curious fingers.

Use placemats instead of tablecloths and turn pot handles inward to prevent children from pulling hot liquids onto themselves.

Tap water safety:

- Set your hot water heater to 125°F or less. Massachusetts law requires a temperature between 110°F and 130°F.

- Supervise young children in the bath and face them away from faucets. Babies and toddlers can turn on hot water when you turn your back.

- Never leave a child in the tub alone for even an instant.

- Use a thermometer to test the water coming out of your bath water tap.

Run your hand through bath water to test for hot spots.

Burn Awareness Week is Shriners Hospitals for Children’s kickoff of a year-long educational campaign aimed at burn awareness and prevention that includes offering free educational materials via the [Be Burn Aware](#) website. The items are designed to be a resource for firefighters, teachers, parents, and others concerned with the safety and well-being of children. Shriners Hospitals have also created an animated video, *Boots and Brewster: The Burn Awareness Pair*, which kids are sure to enjoy. In the video, also available on the website, Boots and Brewster take viewers on a fun and educational adventure to help them become more burn aware.

2021 East-West Shrine Bowl

canceled due to coronavirus concerns



Organizers of the East-West Shrine Bowl™ college football all-star game, benefiting Shriners Hospitals for Children®, announced today that the upcoming game has been cancelled due to challenges presented by COVID-19.

The game had been scheduled for January 23, 2021, at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida.

“It’s terribly disappointing to have to cancel this year’s game, but there are so many issues

involved with bringing in approximately 130 players and 25 NFL coaches from every corner of the United States and Canada,” said Bob Roller, executive director of the East-West Shrine Bowl. “It’s difficult enough currently for these college teams to provide some sort of a bubble during the regular season, but our game occurs after all players have gone home for the holidays. It presented too many potential issues for this one year.”

The nation’s oldest college football all-star game, the East-West Shrine Bowl dates back to its original contest in 1925. It benefits Shriners Hospitals for Children and its mission to provide advanced specialty care for children. The Shriners Hospitals for Children health care system provides excellent care for children with orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families’ ability to pay for services.

Thousands of East-West Shrine Bowl players have gone to the National Football League in nearly a century, including 78 who went on to be enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. As of today, 98 athletes who played in the most recent East-West Shrine Bowl, in January 2020, are currently on NFL rosters.

Some of the many all-star names to play in past games include Tom Brady, Gale Sayers, John Elway, Lawrence Taylor, Pat Tillman, Frank Gifford, Brett Favre, Dick Butkus, Mike Ditka and Roger Staubach.

Players eligible for the 2021 game will still receive formal invitations and become a part of the historical 96-year tradition, Roller said. The entire organization looks forward to the successful return of the game in 2022.
