A Word from Rev. Jackson

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ:

It's hard to believe that February is here and it feels like Christmas was just yesterday. There are several perennial themes that are present in the month of February. Washington's and Lincoln's birthdays and of course Valentine's Day. 1 John draws a rather solid line between the world view of love and the Christian perspective. Consider 1 John 2:15-17 from the New International Version: "On Not Loving the World 15 Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them. ¹⁶ For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life comes not from the Father but from the world. ¹⁷ The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever." Now look at 1 John 4:7-12 from the New International Version: "God's Love and Ours ⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. 9 This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us."

Our love of God is what feeds our Agape love for one another. We all know that there are many situations and people that deplete our Christian love. Years ago, my brothers launched a small boat into the water and it slowly began to sink. I asked them if they had re-installed the plug.....and of course they had not.

The best way to keep God's love in our heart is to keep the "water out" so we don't sink into the storms

that drain our love for another. It is the daily feeding on God's word and prayer that keeps our "love boat" afloat. We will always have many aggravations and choppy seas around us. But if we are feeding our soul via fellowship, scripture, prayer and mission, we will live to sail another day and remain above the waves. Remember: ".....if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us."

May our dedication to serve and love another be our best witness to the Tatnuck Community and beyond. May the historic examples of Washington and Lincoln inspire us to love as they did. May our faith in Jesus Christ inspire us to love one another not just on Valentine's Day, but throughout the year.


