

Pastor's thoughts....

As I begin this article passages from Isaiah 6:11 and Psalm113 haunt my thoughts... "How long O Lord?"

I really want to send an upbeat message of "Joy to the World!" this day and yet the pandemic is wearing me down. I know that I am not alone and this has been the most challenging time of my ministry. I have heard so many crying out "How long O Lord?" as we all long to gather for worship.

Gathering for worship occupies my mind night and day. The Hebrew people knew the importance of gathering and built the great temple in Jerusalem twice. The First Temple was destroyed by the Babylonians and the Second Temple was destroyed by the Romans. Jesus went to the temple and taught in the temple so we know the temple is important.

Jesus declared according to John 2:20-21 that he is the temple. "<sup>20</sup>The Jews then said," "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" <sup>21</sup>But he (Jesus) was speaking of the temple of his body."

Reading that Jesus is also the "temple" of God today reminds me that while we wait to gather, the "temple Jesus" is with us and in us. This gives me comfort and while we ask "How long O Lord?" we are reassured that God is with us. Your church council has also heard your cries and is working to bring us together in a safe and calming way.

The apostle Paul writes to the church in Corinth and I send it to the church of St. Mark's in Polo: 1 Corinthians 13:4-6 "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant for rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; fit does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth." This passage most often used for wedding ceremonies and takes on the true meaning among our congregation today. We love each other and we must be patient and kind. We should not be irritable or resentful.

As we begin a new calendar year, we must all keep Jesus, the "temple", as the "Joy to the World!" in our minds and in our hearts while we ask "How long O Lord?"

Thank you for all of your cards, phone calls, support and love for the Christmas Holiday and for the healing of my broken ankle.

#### Council Highlights from the December Church Council Meeting

**Treasurer's Report**: Income for the month of November was \$5,469 with expenses \$7,069 with a deficit balance of \$1,601 for the month. Year to date deficit stands at \$10,326. The synod is facing a shortfall of \$133,000 this year. We are short about \$2500 of our congregational pledge. A motion was made to send \$750 toward our pledge contribution to the synod. This was approved. The council plans to revisit the remaining pledge at the next meeting.

**Pastor's Report and Worship Plans:** Pastor's ankle is healing very well, she can walk with a boot/brace and therapy continues several times a week. Pastor has been attending a lot of synod meetings via zoom and as well as online learning. Pastor plans to reach out and call many church members during the month of December. Online worship continues. Cheryl Goeking and Beth Wiegmann are working with Pastor for a special Christmas Eve worship online. Beth will be adding music and other pictures. Thank you to Oran, Merla, Cliff and Joey Bardell for putting out the nativity and Christmas wreaths. On Saturday December 12<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am a virtual meeting on ways to do a congregational meeting in a pandemic will be held. Leaders may attend. It is free, no need to register program.

**Hospitality:** The team has been making wellness calls. 206 jars of jelly were collected for the community Christmas Basket program for the Council of Churches.

**Education**: Pastor will be reconnecting with confirmation students this month.

**Local and Global Mission:** Approximately \$500 was collected for the Honduras project. The country has been devastated by hurricanes.

**Polo Council of Churches:** Met by zoom November 24<sup>th</sup> and discussed the Christmas Basket program, turnover of officers in the coming year and the plight of those in Honduras we have come to know.

**Property**: The heating system at church has been erratic. Merla has had the Rockford Furnace people come for an inspection and it all seemed good. Then heating problems arose again so Oran purchased a new thermostat for upstairs hall and Kent helped to program. The technician was called once again to evaluate on December 10<sup>th</sup> and it appears there is a clog in the pipes between the pump and boiler. Special thanks to Merla for monitoring the temperature of the church twice a day. Sara volunteered for janitor duties for the month of January and Kent for the month of February. Also, special thanks to Gabe Booth for raking leaves and weeding the church property.

**Old Business:** A nomination committee as defined by our church constitution is needed as 3 council terms are expiring at the end of January: Amanda Long, Cindy Bauling and Terry Jenkins. They may continue another 3 years after prayerful consideration.

**New Business**: Status of indoor worship – The Council vigorously discussed the return of indoor worship and decided to stand by the previous decision of last month to continue to pause in-person worship for the remaining month of December & January with the intent to re-evaluate based on community COVID conditions at the January council meeting. In preparation for January meeting, Toni and Cindy will meet to discuss possible guidelines for safe in-person worship utilizing the Illinois Department of Public Health worship recommendations. Kent volunteered to bring forward local and state COVID statistics for January council.
