**Houghs Neck Manets Final Season after 67 Years** For the last 67 September's the residents of Houghs Neck have seen the black and gold uniforms practice at Lebreque Field in preparation for their upcoming Quincy Youth Football season. This coming September sadly we will not. This will be the first time since 1951 the Houghs Neck Manets will not field a team. In fact the entire Quincy Youth Football league has come to end of a long continuous era. We say goodbye with a heavy heart to one of the proudest traditions the Houghs Neck Community has had. Going back to 1951.

The Houghs Neck Manets formed and joined The Quincy Youth Football league which already consisted of the North Quincy Apaches, Quincy Point Panthers and the West Quincy

When the Manets were formed it took some financial funding for equipment and uniforms. One of the donations to start the team came from then Senator John F. Kennedy. According to the Quincy Youth football website it didn't take long for the Manets to have success. They won the City Championship in 1954, 1970, 1988, 1990, 1991, 1996, 1997, 2002, and most recently 2016. A few of those years that stand out were the undefeated 1988 Team





Coached by Head Coach Jeff Little, Steve Craig and Dan Morrell. The 1991 undefeated team coached by Head Coach Little, Morrell and Dana Pringle and the 2016 undefeated team coach by Head Coach Mike Flavin, Howie Chadbourne and Kevin Gomez. Over those years the Manets have had many great players. Some of the standout players were 1986 league MVP Mark Bogan, the late Mike Kane, Tommy Morrell, Mark Giordani, and two time league MVP 2015 and 2016 Isaiah Steinberg. Steinberg also holds the record for the most touchdowns (27) in a season. The Manets also have had two coaches that won Coach of the Year of the entire league Jeff Little won the honors twice; once in 1987 and also in 1989 and Mike Flavin won the honors in 2015. The Manets ended their final four seasons on a positive note. Three out of the last four years the Manets played in the Championship Game under Head Coach Mike Flavin.

In 2014 Quincy Youth Football introduced freshman tackle football. Freshman are made up of kids 10 and 11 years old. The Manets had immediate success with this newly formed program with former Manet player Kevin Gomez coaching the team along with Jose Diaz, Darnell Tomer, Roland Dubois and Terry Bowman. Gomez had his team not only undefeated that season but the team never let up a single touchdown. They went on to win the first Quincy Youth Football Freshman Championship. Players that lead that team were Mike Cascarano, Max VanTassel, and team captain Andrew Engren. This year the freshman team also ended the Manets era on a positive note. Coach and franchise holder John MacNeil coached the 2017 team to a winning record and MacNeil's Quarterback Mikey Galligan broke the freshman record for touchdowns scored in a single season.

The Manets were also known for their flag football program and of course their cheerleaders. The cheerleaders had a team for all levels Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity. The cheerleading program was second to none. The Cheerleading program was coached by former Manet Cheerleaders returning to give back to the program and help teach the next generation. Kerry Luggelle, Kaylee Prisco, Kim Fallon, Sue Rheault, Elise Hamel, Erin Fallon, Natalie Chenette, Rachel Beck and Jackie Kane are just few of the many that coached throughout the years.

The team is run by a Franchise holder. Over the years the Manets



#### January will bring two supermoons, a blue moon, & a total lunar eclipse

that appear when the moon is at its closest orbital point to Earth—aren't very rare. Having three in a row certainly is.

And that's exactly what astronomy fans are being treated to this winter.

The first supermoon appeared when the moon swung by Earth 26,500 km (approximately 16,500 miles) closer than usual on Dec. 3. It will reappear as a visible supermoon on New Year's Day 2018 and again on Jan. 31.

Visible supermoons appear 14% bigger and 30% brighter than full moons that occur at the farthest point in the moon's orbit. If you only have time to catch one episode of the trilogy, NASA recommends catching the last one, which will be extra special.

Visible supermoons—full moons Not only is the second full moon of a month considered a blue moon, the Jan. 31 supermoon will also feature a total lunar eclipse, with totality visible from eastern Asia across the Pacific to western North America. During the eclipse, the moon will slowly lose its brightness and take on a reddish hue because of the way the atmosphere bends the light, says NASA. As a result, totally eclipsed moons are sometimes also called "blood moons."

When can I see the lunar eclipse?

On the night of Jan. 31, the lunar eclipse will begin at 11:48am UTC and reach its maximum at 1:30pm UTC. That means viewers who live in eastern North America will need to wake up early to catch the partial eclipse.

I hope the holidays were happy and safe for you and your family. The Legislature will be starting formal sessions after the start of the New Year. Under the Legislature's Joint Rules, the majority of committees will have to report action on legislation by the end of the first week of February. The House and Senate Chairs will have to work with their committee members to determine what action to take on legislation. January promises to be a very busy period.

The Governor signed into law Chapter 138 of the Acts of 2017, which expands on the current mandate requiring schools to use English Sheltered Immersion (SEI) as the default English learner program model. This gives schools the flexibility to establish programs based on the diverse needs of their students. Schooldistricts can continue under the current educational model or choose to implement an alternative instructional program that may more effectively meet the unique needs of their student body. Any new programs would be required to meet federal and state standards. law also increases parental input in the program by expanding the role of Parental Advisory Councils and allowing parents the flexibility to choose programs that best meet their children's needs. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will develop guidelines and establish additional metrics to track student progress. Lastly, the law establishes a Seal of Biliteracy, which is awarded by participating school districts to students who have attained a high level of proficiency in English and one or more foreign languages. Given the large number of English Language Learners in our schools, this will give our school administration, school committee and parents, greater flexibility in developing the best way to teach English to our multinational and multilingual students.

I had the honor of being a part of the first Massachusetts legislative delegation to the People's Republic of China. Majority Leader Ronald Mariano led the delegation of 9 House members on a ten-day trip to the capital of Beijing along with stops in Sichuan and Guangdong provinces. After a 13-hour flight, we were met with Beijing's equally cold weather and it wasn't until several plane rides and bus trips later that we experienced some mild 60-degree weather further south.

While in Beijing we met with the Deputy Director of the People's Republic of China Foreign Ministry and the Director of the Institute of World Economics and Politics. In each province, we met with our provincial legislature's counterparts. We met with the Vice Chairs of the Standing Committees and various committee chairs for the Sichuan People's Provincial Congress and the Guangdong People's Provincial Congress. Much of our discussion revolved around our similar local issues, such as traffic, water and infrastructure,

development and environmental conservation. They were impressed that Massachusetts has chosen to comply with the Paris Accord's environmental information data sharing. The United States Constitution allows states a level of autotomy, which our counterparts were not aware of.

China is undergoing a changing economy, moving away from manufacturing to a commercial/ service industry, very much like Massachusetts. The majority of jobs are located in urban areas. Technology, financial services and a continuously growing consumer market is the future of the Chinese economy. This also results in a rapidly growing cost of living, where housing prices are very high and consumer goods are becoming more expensive. With cities ranging from 3 to over 20 million people, traffic continues to be a massive issue. In Beijing for example, in an effort to mitigate traffic there is a limit on who is allowed to own cars and where and when they can drive. By visiting three distinct parts of China we were able to witness the outcomes of the various economic models the government has implemented in the different economic trade zones throughout the country. The Chinese government is employing different models to test which ones are most effective. There is a tremendous amount of building happening in Chinese cities in an effort to move China forward.


China is home to 1.4 billion people. The infrastructure of their health care system is similar to ours and their average age is close to that of the United States (approximately 37 years old). Like us, their projections show that the average age will not

decline going into 2020. Senior care, cancer, diabetes, and long term chronic illnesses reinforce the importance of preventative care at a younger age and the need for more medical research. They are working on combining traditional Chinese medicine and exercises with modern medical techniques to encourage preventative care.

China's largest telecommunication company is Huawei. The company is known for its cellphones and is projected to overtake Apple as the second biggest selling cellphone company in the world in the next five years. Huawei is heavily invested in telecommunications technology from telemedicine to new data compression technology. 5G wireless telecommunications is coming soon, which allows for greater speed bandwidth. Huawei has been collaborating with other technology companies in dozens of countries to create new ways to maximize consumer and industry use of 5G wireless. We visited Huawei and met with their Vice President of Global Public Affairs to learn more about Huawei's future and possible business ventures for Massachusetts.

Finally, the Wollaston MBTA Station will be closing on Monday, January 8th. The legislative delegation has been working with the MBTA to try and ensure as smooth a transition as possible. Shuttle bus service will be provided between North Quincy, Wollaston and Quincy Center MBTA stations. After significant input by the legislative delegation and constituents at the public meetings, the MBTA will be opening the commuter rail at Quincy Center to allow commuters to ride to South Station for the same fare as a T ride. Happy Holiday's to all in Hough's Neck and Ward 1. It is honor to be able to write to the constituents of Hough's Neck as the new Councillor Elect for Ward 1. Before I get going I would like to wish all the best to Margaret LaForest as she moves on. Thank you very much for your service over the last 8 years.

As the New Year approaches I am prepared to tackle the issues that the neighborhoods addressed as well as many other issues that I came across this past summer. Many of you folks that I spoke with have similar concerns in Hough's Neck and outside of the Neck also. Overdevelopment was a main topic. I am one that frowns on over-development neighborhoods, within our development needs to be where it fits in and must be monitored to a point when development seems to be everywhere. I think the Mayor has got a good plan on development within our city limits, but neighborhoods are a different story. I'm not against development but the changes have to be the correct development and I think the administration believes that also.

The Maritime Center will be relooked. The community felt it was somewhat left out so we need to revisit that again and make sure we get what the community wants. I am definitely for a new facility as the funding process has led us to a good situation (State funding), but we need to get a few more designs that might fit the landscape of what we are used to at the Public Landing. Our Marine unit needs that facility and tools to operate properly in 2018 and on. The facility also needs to able to support small events, HNCC, Summer-time events, etc. These are just a few thoughts but more deliberation will occur in the weeks ahead.

The Seawall program will continue but also be re-looked by myself in order to get up to speed on the entire survey. Manet Ave needs attention as well as other sections. What is on the plate today which is the Willows to Chickatabot Rd. will also get reviewed again.

Top to bottom review of the Snow Removal system for the Ward to include all schools is happening now.

The Flood zone issue is still out there and again I will be sitting with Woodard and Curran to make sure we are proactively involved so you can de updated.

Smaller issues but just as important need addressing: Speed Limit signs on Manet Ave,

Re-painting of all crosswalks in the Ward, Brill Field restoration, Chapel Street Park restoration/cleanup, blighted property issues, and overall understanding when and how we can get streets like Winthrop Ave and others streets paved correctly.

I am very proactive having been sitting with city officials already getting an understanding on who does what. I am very familiar with the city departments and their personnel.

I sit with the Mayor regularly to make sure you folks get what you want or understand why it can't be done. Communication is everyone's friend. I plan to be involved just as I was on the School Committee, making sure everyone's needs are addressed.

NCQA standards aligned with the joint principles of the Patient-Centered Medical Home established with the American College of Physicians, the American Academy of Family Physicians, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Osteopathic Association.




