



How to book

Shuttle buses

Free UEL shuttle buses will be running between the Stratford and Docklands campuses. They will leave approximately every 15 minutes throughout the day. Buses can be caught from Water Lane at Stratford, near the main entrance, and from the car park at the end of the East Building at the Docklands campus.

Visitor Parking

There are a limited number of visitor parking spaces available at our campuses, so we reserve this as disabled parking during our events, which should be pre-booked when registering. For this reason, visitors are advised to use public transport.

Disabilities

Subject taster sessions

Our taster sessions offer the chance to spend some quality time with staff and students from your chosen subjects. Group sizes are deliberately kept small to provide ample opportunity for questions and answers.

At previous events, science and engineering applicants have constructed a working water network model and tested the proximity sensors on an alarm. Art and design applicants have created a smartphone app and learned the stop motion techniques used in animated film work, while budding fashionistas have experienced what it's like to take fashion from concept to reality. Business applicants have tried their hand trading on the stock market in our Bloomberg trading room and health applicants have been hands-on experimenting in the science labs. Social scientists have investigated the effects of power on an individual and explored perceptions of childhood.

All of our workshops, games and interactive sessions are fun and informative, designed to give you a taste of what studying and working in your chosen field will really be like. 
- Civic Engagement Fund provides funding for projects that would support, promote and reinforce connections between students, staff and communities.

- Global Scholars funds social enterprise projects with fellow students from other countries. Students have done placements and projects in Belgium, Turkey, France, Finland, USA, Spain, Cuba, Ghana and Brazil.



With our focus on graduate employability, it's no wonder 87% of our students are in work or further study six months after graduation. We've invested £170 million on our campuses, among the highest university spending according to the Good University Guide 2015.

How to accept your UCAS offer

[First Name] now that you're in the great position of holding a UEL offer, here's what to do next. Accepting your offer is a simple process. Just follow the instructions below and we look forward to seeing you in September.

Step 1: Log into your UCAS Track account: track.ucas.com

You will need your UCAS Personal ID number (10 digits) and your password, which would have been emailed to you from UCAS.

If you do not have this information, or have problems logging in, you will need to call UCAS on 0871 468 0468 (Monday to Friday 8:30 - 18:00).

Step 2: Click 'Your choices' on the top menu

Step 3: Click on 'Reply to your offers'

Once you have heard from your choices the 'Reply to your offers' link will appear on this page.

You can reply even if you have not had a decision from all your choices. If you have heard from the choice you want, you can withdraw any outstanding choices by clicking on the choice and selecting 'Permanently withdraw from this choice'.

Step 4: Select your 'Firm' choice

This is the institution and course you have chosen as your first choice. Find the institution and course and select 'Make this my firm choice'. If you select an unconditional offer as your firm choice then all other choices must be declined.

If you select a conditional offer as your firm choice you will be given the option to select an 'Insurance choice'. You do not have to choose an insurance choice. Select 'Continue'

Step 5: Review and send your reply

The next screen will allow you to review your replies. If you wish to make a change select 'Back'. If you are happy with your replies select 'Send your reply'.

Step 6: Replies will be shown on the 'Your choices' screen in Track


