Staying consistent in the investigation process is crucial. NIOSH investigations, test results of equipment and emotional support are all part of the process.

Mitch stressed the fact that emotions will be high at these scenes. Everyone will want access and everyone will want answers. It will be a struggle to maintain your composure. Use the resources such as media resources. Arrange coordination of the people you need to talk to in different levels of priority. Try and stay focused and organized on the scene.
