This last season, the Glendale Youth Orchestra was honored to be in the Los Angeles Philharmonic's Youth Orchestra Partnership Program (YOPP). The GYO was selected as one of the charter orchestras in this program, and for 2 -1/2 years, our musicians have benefited directly from the participation of LA Phil musicians as coaches.

As a participant in the YOPP, we have been graced by members of the LA Phil sitting in with the kids during rehearsal, offering help with their parts right on the spot. It's the combination of coaching/mini-lesson/rehearsal assistant that makes their presence so very valuable. This last season the following LA Phil members sat in with us in rehearsal: Elizabeth Baker, violin; Judy Mass, violin; Rochelle Abramson, violin; Danny Rothmuller, cello; Ann Gabrielle, oboe; Mark Chernyavsky, violin.

While this great privilege reflects the hard work and talent of our young Musicians it is also the result of teachers such as you. Your hard work training these students with commitment and passion has directly contributed to the successful longevity and quality of the orchestra. Seven more students were selected by audition to perform at our annual Showcase Recital in May. For the first time our program notes for the June concert were beautifully written by a very enthusiastic student instead of by me or a board member.

There are so many opportunities for solo performances and leadership here. It is a particular pleasure to see the students inspire each other. The positive spirit of this group is ideal for a serious student's growth and development, both musically and personally.
