PLEASE COMPLY: This is a fine example of inappropriate use of club property. Blue barrels are not target backers. This one looks like it saw abuse during several shooting sessions at several different angles. The issue (beyond destruction of club property) is ricochets, a HUGE safety concern. Clearly, the impact marks on the top surface did not penetrate the barrel, and skipped.....somewhere. There are similar marks on the sides. This practice is DANGEROUS if done incorrectly. Yes, barrels are used as cover in matches, and take occasional strikes. The difference is, in matches care is taken so that any glancing blows are sent to a berm or other
