Where to Begin

Mark 9:14-29 gives us a fascinating portrait of Jesus. He is confronted by a father with a son who is "possessed by an evil spirit" which seizes the boy and throws him on the ground where he becomes rigid and foams at the mouth. After he engages the father in a conversation, Jesus commands the spirit to come out of him, and he is delivered.

Most Bible scholars recognize that the boy was not possessed by a demon; rather, he showed all the signs of having epileptic seizures. But Jesus does not correct their bad theology. He does not say, "Actually, the boy is not demon possessed. He has a disease called epilepsy." Rather, he answers the father's prayer and heals the boy. In other words, Jesus always starts where we are, rather than where he is.

Jesus always begins where we are. That pattern is repeated throughout the gospels. In John 4, Jesus met a Samaritan woman in Sychar who went to the town well in the heat of the day. Why? My guess is that due to her checkered past, she went when no one else would be around. Instead, she found Jesus sitting there, and he asked her for a drink. This put Jesus in a position of need, whereby he was better able to pique her interest and engage her in a conversation, acknowledging her shameful past, but without shaming her. The woman soon realizes that she has just met the Messiah and becomes the first evangelist as she rushes back into Sychar to tell her neighbors about the One who "told me everything I ever did" (John 4:29). In other words, she became the first evangelist.

Jesus always begins where we are. And that, in a nutshell, is the story of the Incarnation, the birth of the Messiah. Jesus took up residence in our neighborhood so we could one day take up residence in his.

We, too, are to begin where people are. In some cases, that's easy to do. In other cases, not so much because people are a messy lot. I don't mean that they're untidy. Rather, they might embrace bad theology. They might have a checkered past. They might be filled with shame. They might have a lifestyle that we don't agree with. But they are our neighbors, and we are to love them. And we are to connect them to Jesus Christ. So we begin where they are.

Unfortunately, our natural tendency is to (continued on page 2)

begin where we are, with our own beliefs about God and sin and shame. We want to tell our story, rather than listen to theirs. But that's not the Jesus way. Jesus always began where his neighbors were.

We live in a messy, complicated world. When I was a child, most people went to church on Sundays. Today, most people stay home. And the fastest growing religion in America today is "None of the above." And yet, people today are just like that father who brought his son to Jesus. People today are still just like that woman from Sychar who had been married five times. People are still messy and need Jesus. They just don't know it. Can we love them into the kingdom of God? I believe we can.


