## Guild Meeting Minutes

#### January 29, 2024

Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm by Stevie Breit. Stevie announced that Crazy Quilters' raffle quilt was displayed at the back of the room. Also being raffled is a Bernina 325.

Regina Scott Brooks told the members that the theme for this year is "Finish It Up". She explained the rules, which included completing the form that's been in the newsletter listing your UFO's and then showing it to Regina at the beginning of the January or February meeting. If you finish six of the UFO's listed on your form by the October meeting, then your name will be entered in a prize drawing. All of the rules and the form to complete were in the January newsletter. Regina announced her favorite show of the year, the annual "Then and Now" presentation by a few guild members where they show a few of the quilts they have completed and talk about their "quilting journey."

Next month's program will be presented by a Moda designer, Stephanie Sliwinski of Fancy That Design House. She will talk about her quilting journey and tell us what it's like to be a Moda designer. In March, Cheryl Schenck will demonstrate quilting tips and tricks, and will also teach a class on machine quilting. More details will be in the February newsletter.

Grace Kragness, Treasurer, presented the 2023 final budget and expenses. All of the 2023 reserves were not used. The cost of the Holiday Party next year will go up a nominal amount. The 2024 Budget was previously emailed to guild members. After discussion, Darlene Krueger made a motion that the 2024 Budget be approved. Judy Martin seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Autumn Latimore talked to us about this year's donations by the guild. She had hoped that Dan Taivalski, Director of the Food Pantry, would be available to talk to guild members tonight but he was not available. He will come at a later date. Autumn asked about members' feelings regarding where guild support would be directed this year and listed options: Continue donating food and money to the Food Pantry each month, donate food items and money to the Veterans' Tiny Houses and their marketplace, or a mix of both. Discussion was had among the members and a motion was called for. Claudia Grace made a motion that the guild continue to give to the Food Pantry because of its larger outreach. The motion was seconded. Motion passed with one nay and two abstentions. Claudia Grace mentioned that her church meets at the Tiny Houses once a month with a meal for the residents. Contact Claudia if interested in participating. The food donation to the Food Pantry for February will be cereals and proteins.

Kris Hagen said there were 54 members present in person, nine additional members by Zoom. and two guests. Door prizes were distributed.

The Show & Tell consisted of a few people displaying their new name tags. Regina encouraged everyone to make a new name tag.

Meeting was adjourned.


