

### **Sniecikowski, Roman J.**

Roman Joseph Sniecikowski, 86, of Caseville Township, passed away Thursday, December 28, 2006, at St. Mary's Medical Center in Saginaw. He was born in Detroit on February 28, 1920, son of the late Anthony and Anna (Rodnicki) Sniecikowski. He served with the United States Army in the European Theater during World War II earning a Purple Heart for his efforts. On June 25, 1947, he was united in marriage to Lillian Yettke who preceded him in death on March 21, 1992. He married Rita Giacalone Grabish in Las Vegas on June 14, 1994. She survives him. Mr. Sniecikowski worked as production supervisor at the Chrysler Corporation Mack Avenue Stamping Plant for 37 years retiring in 1975.
