The "already" refers to the fact that God has acted decisively in human history through the Incarnation of His Son; his life, miracles and teaching; concluding with Jesus' death and resurrection. We live this reality each day and especially when we gather for the Eucharist and celebrate Christ living presence in Word and Sacrament.

The "not vet" refers to the fact that Jesus has not yet come again in glory. In the meantime, it is our fervent hope and prayer that God's kingdom might come in its fullness "Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done...".

We believe that Jesus will reappear in glory "to judge the living and the dead" and inaugurate the final other-worldly phase of the kingdom. What a joyful day that will be!
