PSSC MEETING MINUTES 01/15/14

The Prairieland Standard Schnauzer meeting was held at Penny and Kathy's home in Bloomington, IL on 1/15/14. After dinner, Vice President Connie Reidner opened the business meeting at approximately 7:15 pm. President Marsha was absent due to illness.

In attendance were Kathy Koehler, Lynne and Barry Conder, Penny Duffee, Connie and Ron Reidner, Larry and Cheryl Wallace, and Larry Davis and daughters.

Treasurer's Report: Kathy Koehler reported the treasury balance. Report was accepted as presented. (Larry/Barry) A copy of the report is available by request from the treasurer or secretary.

Secretary's Report: Marsha asked that the Minutes of the last meeting be accepted as published. Minutes were accepted with no additions or corrections. (Larry/Ron)

OLD BUSINESS PSSC website

- Larry is going to add a "Performance" tab to our website. Alexis Hubbard has agreed to be contact person for agility items or news. Jeanne Greenwalt's name was suggested to Larry as obedience contact.
- It was also suggested to add items SSCA sells, such as grooming video, sourcebooks, etc.

Festival of Trees 2013

• PSSC donated 32 centerpieces and wreaths this year. It was reported our donated items brought in approximately \$1350 for the local Baby Fold, the benefitting agency.

'If I Ran the Dog Show' book donation

- This elementary school book is part of the Dr. Seuss's Cat in the Hat Learning series. The book, also endorsed by NAIA to which we annually donate, is meant to encourage elementary school children's interest in dogs and dog shows. The books can be purchased through NAIA and donated to schools for \$6.00 each.
- In earlier meetings, we voted to distribute books to local District 87 and 5 elementary schools. The books would be promoted within each school by the school's librarian. Connie R. confirmed that any dog book is popular with younger school kids. In September '13, we agreed to purchase 50 copies for distribution to include local schools. This educational activity additionally counts as one of the AKC required activities for approval of our PSSC specialty show application.
- Currently the books are on order and expected to arrive soon. Diane & Don Kachur were suggested for coordinating distribution since Diane is still currently teaching in a local school.

NEW BUSINESS

AKC Reunite Disaster Relief Trailer Project

- Harvey Mohrenweiser, SSCA's AKC delegate, sent info regarding this project. This is an effort to donate mobile trailers filled with non-perishable pet sheltering supplies to local emergency management teams. These trailers will store and deliver essential supplies to help pets as a result of a disaster. The trailers are meant to provide animal care services during the first 72 hours following a disaster, the critical time before FEMA support and services are deployed.
- At the January 2014 SSCA Board meeting, it was decided SSCA would explore working with their member clubs, as they are the folks with "boots on the ground," both in terms of providing assistance as well as being directly impacted when disasters occur.
- Harvey is asking if our club is interested in supporting this project in our area.
- We reviewed the materials Harvey sent and discussed our many questions and options. The decision was to reply we feel unprepared to take on such a large effort with our small club. We did feel, however, that making a donation was within our capabilities and responsibility. The basic questions are: how much money and to whom should we donate strictly on our own in PSSC's name to a more local effort or to SSCA for the larger benefit. Additionally, if we donate to SSCA, what area would that money benefit.
- Plans are to re-discuss this topic at the March meeting.

PSSC May 2014 specialty

- We briefly discussed trophy ideas submitted by Penny and Kathy.
- Barn Hunt at May specialty
 - Penny, Kathy, Gwen K and Connie R attended a Barn Hunt instinct/fun run type event in St. Louis this past fall. They would like PSSC to offer a similar event at our May specialty. The goal would be to have a full trial in 2015.
 - Best days for the event will be Friday and Saturday of the weekend, since Sunday is our specialty.
 - o SSs will have preferred entry time slots. Onofrio can save a page in Premium List for entry info.
 - Entry fee will likely be around \$20. Profits would, however, have to be shared with the overall Cluster Committee sponsoring the weekend shows since we will use their facilities.
 - Costs for bales of hay, rats, containers for the rats, etc are being investigated. Also what to do
 with the rats after the event needs to be figured out. Figures to be presented at March meeting.
 - MANY volunteers will be needed to hold a barn hunt, but it will be fun to see this new event for our talented SSs. Connie Reidner has already volunteered to handle entry registration.

Specialty banquet and Picnic

- The local VFW, where we've had previous banquets is reserved for Sunday night, 5/25. We had to pay \$100 deposit, which will be returned after we adequately clean the room.
- We'll discuss final choice of entrees at the March meeting. Attendees will need to submit meal choices 2 weeks prior to banquet.
- We'll try to encourage more participation this year with a write-up in PNS ahead of time.
- Penny and Kathy volunteered to have the Saturday, 5/24, potluck picnic at their house again this year.

AKC President's Challenge

- This request is for donations that go toward educating legislators and fanciers about fair policy for dog breeding and ownership, and opposing legislation that restricts responsible dog owners' rights.
- We voted to not donate this year (Lynne/Ron) since we donate to Illinois Federation of Dog Clubs and Owners (IFDCO), which has a similar goal.


FESTIVAL OF TREES
