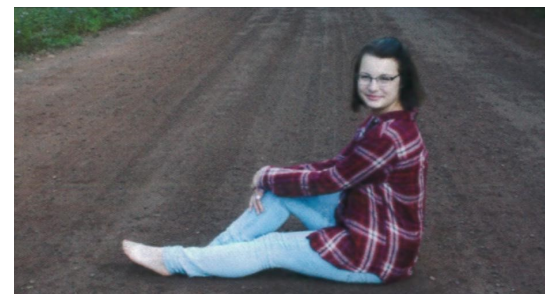
Emily will attend Northern Michigan University for a year and then pursue a degree in web design at the college of her choice in the years to follow.
