Weekday Masses are celebrated usually at 10 a.m. Please check the schedule in the bulletin. oday, Jesus challenges his listeners to be open to the gift of faith that will enable them to appreciate the Eucharistic Mystery and explains further what this faith implies. Jesus is the revelation of the Father – he has truly 'come from God' and 'has seen the Father'. Those who



live by the faith Jesus is offering 'hear the teaching of the Father and learn from it'. This faith also recognizes that all the promises that sustained Israel's faith are being fulfilled in Jesus, "the living bread that came down from heaven". Jesus concludes his teaching today with the words "Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh". We hear these climactic words echoed by Jesus during the Institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper and by the Priest during the Consecration at each Mass: "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you". Let us give thanks to God this week for the gift of faith and the gift of the Eucharist.

AUGUST 15 - SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, SPECIAL PATRON OF ACADIANS:

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates her being assumed – taken up body and soul – into heaven at the end of her earthly life. In declaring the doctrine of the Assumption (1950), the Church proclaims and celebrates that in Mary there was no obstacle to deny her

immediate passing through death and becoming the first after her Son to be raised body and soul to fullness of life with God.

BAPTISM STIPEND - \$25.00 - Baptisms are celebrated by appointment (after a Baptism Preparation Course has been completed).

BAPTISM PREPARATION: The baptism of a child is a very important event in the life of the child. the child's family, and the parish community. To help parents enter more fully into the celebration of their child's baptism, St. Joseph's Parish offers a Baptism Preparation Course by appointment. Parents along with godparents are expected to attend the Baptism Preparation Course before the baptism of the child. Please call the Parish Office to register.

MARRIAGE STIPEND - \$200.00 - Please allow at least six months between the time of contacting the Parish and the date of the Marriage. A Marriage Preparation Course is required.

FUNERAL STIPEND - \$200.00 - St. Joseph's Parish has a Bereavement Committee to assist with planning funeral services.

HEARING ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

T t Joseph's Church has an FM System installed which will allow those with hearing challenges to use the system in order to improve their ability to hear the readings and prayers.

In order to use the system, you will need to obtain an FM receiver and either a headset or hearing loop from the Hospitality Ministry, when you enter the church. As we have limited numbers they will be issued on a first come basis.

To use the headset, plug it into the receiver and adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

To be able to use the hearing loop, you must have hearing aids that have a T-coil, and it needs to be activated by your hearing care professional if it is not. To determine whether you have T-coil or not, the model number for the hearing aids that have a T-coil installed will end

The units must be returned immediately following the liturgy.

The 2023-24 Living with Christ Sunday Missal is available at the Parish Office for \$5.00 $oldsymbol{\perp}$ each. This missal helps Catholics prepare for and participate in the Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy. It is also useful for personal devotion. The Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

August 13 - Memorial of Saint Pontian, Pope, and Saint Hippolytus, Priest, Martyrs: During a period of persecution, both Pontian, who had succeeded Pope Urban I in 230, and Hippolytus, who was a priest, a well- known scholar and theologian, were exiled to the unhealthy mines of Sardinia. It was there that they met each other. Hippolytus had rebelled against the Church, but was reconciled through the efforts of Pontian. Hippolytus wrote many works, including a prayer on which our Eucharistic Prayer II is based. Both Pontian and Hippolytus died a martvr's death.

AUGUST 14 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST, MARTYR:

A modern day martyr. Maximilian was born in Poland in 1894 and later joined the Franciscans. He worked to spread the Gospel in his native Poland as well as in Japan. He had a great devotion to Our Lady. During the Nazi occupation of Poland, he helped thousands of refugees, including Polish Jews. He was arrested by the Gestapo in 1941 and imprisoned at Auschwitz. When a prisoner escaped, ten men were chosen at random to die, one of them a young father. Maximilian offered to take his place. His offer was accepted. He died in 1941 and was canonized in 1982.
