Building the 18th Century Pistol Guest instructor: Mark Wheland of Williamsburg, Pa. Students will start with a pistol stock blank with a pre-inlet barrel. Mark will teach proper layout and sequence in building a Kentucky / Pennsylvania pistol. Emphasis will be on proper lock and trigger placement in relationship to achieving proper trigger pull location. Students will inlet a lock and manufacture and install a simple trigger to achieve correct stock geometry. Any additional time will be spent shaping your pistol project.

Class fee of \$250.00 plus the cost of the components to build the project.

- 11:30 to 1:30 Closing remarks, area clean up and Lunch.


