Explore Tottenham Forest



Follow the bright green paint blazes.

The hills are formed due to the receding ice age of 11,000 years ago. As the ice melted it dumped the stones and gravel that it had collected while it was still advancing. Note the creek at the south end of this forest which runs into Beeton Creek and eventually into the Nottawasaga River.

POINTS OF INTEREST

- 1. Red Pines** were planted to stabilize the sandy soils.
(GPS - N43°59'882" W79°47'788")
- 2. Birth of River.** Sometimes dry, but after rain this is where a river is born. (GPS - N43°59'827" W79°47'486")
- 3. Tecumseth Pines** adult community adjacent to the trail.
(GPS - N44°44'549" W79°39'525")
- 4. Marshes** are critically important wildlife habitat, often serving as breeding grounds for a wide variety of animal life.
(N43°59'314" W79°47'430")
- 5. High Point** of the moraine. You are standing on a big gravel heap.
(N43°59'244" W79°47'584")
- 6. Stream Creatures:** Look for crayfish and aquatic worms.
(N43°59'311" W79°47'582")
- 7. Biodiversity** is often a measure of the health of a forest. Note the different varieties of trees that grow to make this a healthy forest.
(N43°59'405" W79°47'565")
- 8. CP Rail** line that carries goods to northern Ontario.
(N43°59'830" W79°47'793")

Note: Follow the bright green paint blazes around the loop trail.
