Deck the Halls...with Holiday Safety

The Christmas holiday season is upon us once again, and it's a time to spend with family without worrying about the safety of your home. Keep your family and property secure this holiday season by following these practical tips to avoid hazards.

Christmas Tree

The winter months see an increase in residential fires. To minimize this risk, place your Christmas tree away from high-traffic areas, doorways, and exits, and never position it near a heat source. If you have a real Christmas tree, cut about 2 inches off the trunk and place it in a sturdy stand. Be aware of the potential holiday hazards that may arise.



Holiday Lights

To prevent fires, always turn off all decorative lights when you leave the house or go to bed. Place extension cords next to the wall to avoid tripping hazards, and do not run cords under rugs or carpets. One extension cord should connect a maximum of three mini light sets or 50 screw-in bulbs.

Holiday Cooking

Unattended cooking is the leading cause of home fires during the holidays in the U.S. Always stay in the kitchen when frying, broiling, or grilling food. If you need to leave the kitchen for any reason, make sure to turn off the stove. During this holiday season, be especially cautious with children around and help ensure that nothing spoils the fun.
