- Disbursements limited to \$1500/dog/year
- Allows nonprofit to receive 10% of funds for administrative costs including salaries and benefits
- Appropriates \$300,000 each fiscal year to fund

Creates new courtesy permit for veterinarians licensed in another jurisdiction wanting to temporarily practice in the state AND new relief permit for veterinarians in another jurisdiction that is filling in for an absent veterinarian in the state:

- Limited to 30 days plus 1 renewal in 12-month period 60 days total
- Require regular license if more than 2 permits in 2 years
- Need: active license in another jurisdiction, desire to practice only temporarily in state, and sponsor (not required to be on same island for relief permit)
- Must: consent to jurisdiction and authority of board, practice under supervision of sponsor (courtesy only), not practice independently of sponsor in state, comply with these laws, cease to offer services if license or practice no longer active or is limited in other jurisdiction, notify board in 15 days of disciplinary action in another jurisdiction or convicted of criminal offense in another jurisdiction, and pay all costs for investigation or enforcement
- Prohibits having courtesy permit and relief permit during same 12 months
- Sponsors must determine level of supervision required, veterinary care given by permittee, notify board in writing, and confirm permittee has proper state permit
- Pay \$100 surcharge for administration costs nonrefundable

### Allows veterinary telemedicine:

- Limited to veterinarian-client-patient relationship and only between exams and visits to premises
- Must conduct evaluations with acceptable standards of care, take precautions to safeguard confidentiality, make client aware of vet identity, location, license number and status, and maintain records
- Medicines require veterinarian-client-patient relationship
- Allows veterinary teleadvice or teletriage without relationship poison control agency expert may also provide teletriage
- Allows veterinary telesupervision for tasks not requiring supervision
- Adds relevant definitions

Revises what is considered practicing vet medicine and needing license

- Now includes assessments
- Exempts those in another jurisdiction under sponsor/indirect supervision during emergency up to 21 days and courtesy and relief permit
- For examination, now allows graduates of a foreign college of veterinary medicine that meets requirements of AVMA Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates or the American Association of Veterinary State Boards Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education Equivalence
- Exams no longer required to be conducted twice a year

Creates new temporary permits for graduates – limit 1 nonrenewal permit and limited to 24 months

- Be graduate of college meeting AVMA Council of Education OR foreign college of veterinary medicine under AVMA Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates or the American Association of Veterinary State Boards Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education Equivalence OR have license in another state
- Must be supervised by another veterinarian with licensed vet on same island during practice and available daily for consultation

- Penalty for manufacturer selling in violation is civil violation with fine up to \$1000 for 1<sup>st</sup> day and \$500 per additional day
