Sanctuary Video Screen Update

Most of the Ethernet and HDMI wiring for our video screen project is complete and one of two needed electrical outlets have been installed. Some additional equipment will be installed and electrical work will be



completed soon. Two 85" screens have been purchased, and Audio Labs will install the screens this month. We look forward to having video screens in the sanctuary very soon.

The reason we are installing the screens is a little different than is often the case. Many churches use screens to project words to songs, announcements, video clips, and sermon illustrations. We will have that capability, but the primary reason we are installing screens at this time is to make the worship experience more engaging for those who are at home.

That sounds a little odd, doesn't it? How will screens in the sanctuary help people who are at home?

The last two Sundays, over half of our congregation was worshiping via Zoom. We are averaging 40-45% online. That is far more than most churches I know of. Being a hybrid church in which those who are at home can participate and connect rather than simply watch a screen is a challenge. We have learned and innovated over the past few years, and we are still learning. Besides all of the other potential uses, the screens will allow folks who are at home to read scripture, lead prayer, and participate in worship leadership. I expect that there will be some hiccups along the way, but this is exciting.

Back in 2019, if someone had told us that in 4 years, half of our church would be worshiping from home – not only from Ames but from around the country – and that folks at home could lead worship, even bring the sermon from home – that would have sounded ridiculous. But here we are.

In worship, we are looking at scriptures from the Book of Acts. Acts tells of the spread of the gospel throughout the Mediterranean world. On nearly every page, we learn of God doing new things. It is in the church's DNA to be able to change and be open to new possibilities. I am thankful that our church has been open to change and open to the leading of God's Spirit. The logistics of our worship is a lot less important than the way we show love for our neighbors and live out our faith by following Jesus, but for me, this project is an effort to better engage and include those who can't be with us in person. In other words, it is about being inclusive more than just getting more technologically current.
