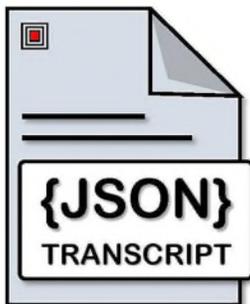

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JSON TRANSCRIPT STANDARDS DEVELOPMENT WORKGROUP LAUNCHES PESC EXPANDS TECHNOLOGY BASE WITH JSON AND JSON-LD

Washington, D.C. ~ The Postsecondary Electronic Standards Council ([PESC](#)) is pleased to announce the formation and launch of the [JSON Academic Transcript Standards Development Workgroup](#). The request to form the JSON Transcript Workgroup originated with support from PESC Members: Parchment, AcademyOne, University of Southern California, Bardic Systems, DegreeData, AACRAO, National Student Clearinghouse and Digitary.

These PESC Members intend to work openly and collaboratively with the education community and all stakeholders to develop and submit a candidate standard to be released and published as a PESC Approved Standard. PESC High School and College Transcript Approved Standards are currently available in EDI, PDF and XML technologies. This effort to add a JSON version of the Transcript as a PESC Approved Standard marks PESC's first step toward JSON and JSON-LD, technologies more compatible with web servers, browsers, mobile applications and the internet.

Re: Letter of Intent – JSON Transcript Workgroup

Dear Michael Sessa:

We are pleased to notify PESC that Parchment, AcademyOne, University of Southern California, Bardic Systems, DegreeData, AACRAO, National Student Clearinghouse and Digitary intend to lead open, transparent and collaborative efforts with the education and employment communities through PESC to develop the High School and College Transcripts in JSON technology.

We support the proposed development, submission and consideration of the Transcripts in JSON as PESC Approved Standards, including the exploration of how to enhance the standard to be compatible with other existing and emerging data standards. The proposed standards can be used by organizations, schools, colleges and universities for the exchange of academic data to facilitate the migration, advancement and accomplishments of students throughout their entire educational process. We anticipate that the deliverables will include the proposed JSON schema, Implementation Guide(s) and Instance/Example documentation.
