Last week, the wilderness was the scene of the Gospel. This week a mountain and cloud are the location of the narrative. In Scripture, mountains are places in which sacred encounters and divine revelations occurred. Moses and Elijah received unique experiences of God and their commissioning to God's people on mountain peaks.

For Jesus, the mountain is already a place of encounter with God, a place of pray-

er. Jesus takes three of his disciples up a mountain where they experience Jesus as never before. His face becomes radiant with light and his clothes become dazzling white. Elijah and Moses, key prophetic figures of Israel, "appear" and enter into dialogue with Jesus, endorsing him as a Chosen One. Peter is overwhelmed and wants to hold onto this ecstatic experience, "Master, it's wonderful to be here. Let us set up tents - one for you, one for Elijah and one for Moses." They then hear the voice of God acknowledging Jesus as the Beloved Son and urging them to open their hearts to listen to him, as they leave the mountain to accompany him on his journey towards the cross.

Like Jesus and his companions, we too need the occasional mountain experience. This may come through perceiving the love of God shining through the kindness and faithful love of another. If might come in quiet reflective moments, when we can let go of the cares of the day and open our hearts to take in the preciousness of life itself and the strength that comes from our faith, knowing that the love of God is always with us. But we can't stay on the mountain in devotional solitude: sooner or later we must continue on the way of Jesus: facing the challenges of life but reflecting God's love in our families, neighbourhoods and to the suffering, poor and belittled in our world.

A seven year old boy was having a sleepover at his grandparents' place. After sharing a story the grandmother asked, "Would you like the light on in case you wake up? If you do and feel afraid, look at the light and you'll know that God is near you, loving you". "No thanks Gran', he replied and tapped his chest. "God is in here in my heart! When I get scared I remember that. Good night!"

I trained in a college to be a teacher in a public high school. I taught for some years and also volunteered to teach catechism in my diocese. I entered the national seminary of Laos in 2004.

After I completed philosophy and theology, I went back to my own diocese and again volunteered to teach catechism in remote areas where priests hardly ever go. During this time I was discerning my vocation to the priesthood. I considered various religious congregations. I heard about the Divine Word Missionaries (SVD) from a friend, who gave me the address of the vocation director. I also found the SVD via Google. After some months I was invited to come and experience the SVD's mission with HIV/Aids sufferers in Thailand. I decided to join the SVD and did my initial training in Thailand. For my novitiate I was sent to the Philippines, there I professed my first vows as SVD. After that, I came to Australia to continue my theological studies at Yarra Theological College, University of Divinity, Melbourne."

Toub made his final religious vows on Saturday, 9th March and was ordained Deacon in Box Hill last Sunday. We cordially welcome Toub in our Sacred Heart Community.
