CHAPTER HALL OF FAME

PURPOSE OF THE HALL OF FAME

THE PURPOSE OF THE HALL OF FAME IS TO RECOGNIZE MEMBERS OF THE CHAPTER WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED LEADERSHIP AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CHAPTER THAT REFLECT THE HIGH IDEALS OF PENNSYLVANIA STATE UNIVERSITY AND DEDICATION TO THE CHAPTER AND COMMUNITY.

AWARD CRITERIA

THE CRITERIA FOR SELECTION REQUIRE THE CANDIDATE TO BE A MEMBER OR PAST MEMBER OF THE DAYTON CHAPTER OF THE PENN STATE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION. MEMBERSHIP MUST BE FOR AT LEAST 10 YEARS. THE MEMBER MUST HAVE BEEN AN ACTIVE MEMBER WHO PARTICIPATED REGULARLY IN THE CHAPTER EVENTS AND PROGRAMS AND CONTRIBUTED LEADERSHIP QUALITIES THAT MAY INCLUDE BEING AN OFFICER, BOARD MEMBER OR COMMITTEE OR EVENT CHAIR. THE CANDIDATE'S ACTIONS DEMONSTRATE DEVOTION TO THE MISSION AND OBJECTIVES OF THE UNIVERSITY AND MARKED BY INITIATIVE, LEADERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION SKILLS.
