New Monthly Program: Monthly 'Yagya' 'Homa'

In our continued efforts to introduce new activities & further involve the community, starting March 2010 we are introducing a new Program to the Monthly calendar—The Yagya or Havan Puja.

Homa is an ancient Hindu ritual performed to invoke Agni, the God of fire, by offering Ghee & other sacrificial offerings. As Havih means Ghee and Havisha means offering, **Yagya** means sacrifice. Havan has 3 purposes - Prayer to Gods, Developing community harmonious company and Charity. Brahma is the creator of the world and Sun God is His son. Fire represents Sun. The fire is lit to invite Agni. Ghee & Havan samagri are offered into the as ahuti or blation into the fire as Mantras are being chanted. The word Swaha is uttered at each offering. Swaha is agni's wife's name.

Upcoming Yagya Dates: March 14th - Chandi Yagya, April 11 - Vishnu Yagya, May 9th - Laxmi Narayan Yagya. It is not mandatory for the sponsor to be physically available for the yagya, it can be performed on your behalf by Panditji. Also the family doing the yagya is not obligated to provide a meal, in fact we encourage pot-luck as much as possible. In addition you are welcome to do it as one family or combine two or more families.
