OLD BUSINESS

Finance Reports...will be doing sub-accounts starting in January 2019

Budget....State/Local/Town/Village Agencies are governed by NYS Statutes and guidance from NYS Comptroller's Office, not subject to GAAP (General Accepting Accounting Practice), Town is on cash basis and an annual audit is done to NYS Comptroller's Office.

Sheriff... Supervisor has spoken to the Sheriff's Department, they do patrol the town more than we might think, will come to a future meeting to discuss and residents' concerns.

Fines....for example: Speeding ticket...Town gets 15%, the other 85% goes to Court

System to pay for County Justice/District Attorney, etc.

Broadband....Spectrum and Slic Network were here, both toured the town. Supervisor O'Brien took the fella from Slic Network around South Road, County Route 18, Hickey and Hills Pond Roads to see the houses/roads areas to be covered. Supervisor and Bonnie Hawley did the same with the fella from Spectrum. Slic Network, which is a NYS Company, will be covering Low Hampton.

Health Account for Highway Employees... signatories for the account will be David O'Brien, Herb Sady, Jr and Rebecca Jones.

Highway Superintendents Report

December 20, 2018

The men have been up-keeping the maintenance on the equipment. They got the oil and filter changed in the 2000 international. We had a couple of little ice storms that we had to go out and spread some salt and sand. The 2012 has a small antifreeze leak. We brought it up to Turunen's and he did a pressure test on it and found a couple of leaks, but he didn't fix them because we need the truck back at the garage for plowing. When it looks like we have some clear days it will go back up. We graded Hickey Road, Hills Pond Road, and Staso Road and also filled in some potholes. We have received the new Hills Pond Road signs, those will go up tomorrow. The plow that is on the 2012 Dodge is in severely bad condition and needs replacing, I have received just one quote back so far. We only need the moldboard not the complete set-up. We started chipping on Roberts Road today and will continue to chip next week. We were able to use one of the County's chippers. The state is finished with route 22a and has left the rest of the stone in the pile to the Highway Department. Adam Nimms thanked us for letting them use our facilities for this operation. They are coming back in the spring to clean the pile of old blacktop that was left there.
